That the above resolutions take effect, and that the said rates and duties be diminished accordingly, and the reduced rates and duties be paid and payable, as to all British vessels, from and after the 1st day of January 1823, and as to all foreign vessels, from and after the same day, or as soon after the said 1st day of January 1823, as the countries or nations to which such foreign vessels shall belong, shall admit British vessels into their ports upon the same terms, with respect to port and harbour dues and rates, as their own vessels.
