BY virtue of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, the Corporation of Trinity-House, London, is empowered, upon the requisition or with the consent of His Majesty, his heirs and successors, in his or their Most Honourable Privy Council, from time to time to reduce, relinquish, abolish, alter, or modify all or any or either of the rates, prices, dues, duties, or tolls, or any part or parts thereof, payable to them, and again to revive and reestablish the same in manner as in the said Act is more particularly set forth; in pursuance of this authority, the said Corporation have submitted certain propositions for the reduction and modification of the rates or duties payable to them, which having received His Majesty's royal assent and confirmation, at a Council held at Brighton, on the 15th of November last;
