WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto the King, that, on Sunday the 8th day of December instant, some evil-disposed person or persons did knowingly send a letter, without a name subscribed thereto, threatening to burn and destroy the out-houses and stacks of corn of Richard Burton, of Broadcliff, in the county of Devon, yeoman, and of divers other persons in the said letter mentioned; and it hath been further humbly represented unto the King, that, on the night of Saturday the 14th day of December instant, some evil-disposed person or persons did wilfully and maliciously set fire to a rick, containing a considerable quantity of corn, the property of the said Richard Burton, situate near to the village of Broadcliff aforesaid, whereby the said rick was burnt down and destroyed;
