Bruffels, January 15. Notwithstanding the Term given by the French King is expired, the Prince de Chimay Governor of Luxemburg, and leveral other Governors and Principal Commanders have leave to continue here; and we do not hear of the mo-tion of any French Troops. The Count of Manf felt, the Emperors Ambassador to the King of Spain, will continue here till two Couriers which have been fent to Madrid and Vienna return, and in the mean time he has frequent Conf. rences with his Excellency concerning the present Astairs. It is faid that his Exc liency has refolved not to raife any new Troops, but to recruit those that are already on foot; and that he has made an agreement with some Persons who have undertaken to furnish 2 foo Hor'es; which is a thing very necessary, above a third part of our Cavalry and Dragoons beirg dilmounted, and fome whole Regiments.

Bruffels, fanuary 19. On Sunday last was kept the Feall of St. Anthony, his Excellency the Marquis de Grans, who had taken upon him the Quality of Prevoft, having the day before received into the Fraternity Don Antonio d' Agurto, Maistre de Camp General of these Provinces, the Prince de Vau-demont General of the Horse, the Marquis de Bed. mar General of the Artillery, the Prince Barbancon Governor of the Province of Namur, the Prince of Chimay Governor of Luxemburg, and several others of the first Quality. His Excellency, as Prevost, gave the Entertainment, which was very splendid, and the Prince de Vaudemont was choien Prevost for the next year. His Excellency and Count Manffelt intended to have gone, as this day, for Antwerp, but the Count having received advis by an Express from Paris, that his Secretary is released out of the Baftille, he intends to part from hence to morrow or the day following on his Journey for Spain, which he will take through France.

Hague, Fanuary 15. Some days fince arrived here the Heer Hunnicke, Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of Saxony; and the Heer d' Amerongen late Envoy from this State at the Courts of Saxony and Brandenburg, is on his return, and every day expected The States, upon the Report of the Deputics of the Admiralties, have confiderably leffened the Charge of the intended Equipage, ordering the Ships to be of lower Rates than was at first designed; Eight are to carry from 70 to 80 Guns, eight from so to 70, and eight from 30 to 45; which, it's faid, are to be fitted out at the charge of the Admiralties the States giving some assistance thereunto; and this Squadron is reported to be defigned for the affiftance of the Suedes. The Heer Heinfins, Ambaifador Extraordinary from this State to the most Christian King, is upon his departure.

Paris, January 16. The 14 Instant Don Carlos del Callillio, whom the King of Spain sent to perform his Compliments at this Court upon the Birth of the Duke of Burgundy; had his Audiences of Leave of the King, Queen, &c. having been Treated, during the time he was at Verfailles, by the Kings Officers. We have Advice, That the Archbishop of Gnessa, Primate of Poland, having called his Clergy together, had condemned the Propositions of the Clergy of this Kingdom in their last Assembly, and that he had therein followed the example of the Arch-

bishop of Gran, Primate of Hungary, who had in like mann r condemned the said Proportions; and we are told that the Pope has desired other Princes to cause their Clergy o meet for the same purpose.
