Vienna, Jan. 10.

Two days since arrived here the Count de Spenara, who has for some time resid d. by the Emperors order, with Count Teckley; and yesterday arrived two Explores from Hungary, we cannot learn what they brought, farther than that in the general they give an account of the great preparations of the Turcs, and that Count Teckley has so far engaged himself with them that he cannot hearken to any Proposals that are made from hence, for his separate Accommodation. The 8th Instant 1000 Horse marched in two Bodies under the Command of the Baron de Borschira, and the Count of Sallaburg, towards the Waag, where they are to quarter to hinder the incursions of the Turcs; and another Party of Horse and Dragoons is ordered to march to the Berg-Towns to cover the Miners. There is now no more discourse of the Emperors Journey to Ratisbonne; but it is said, that his Imperial Majesty will send the Prince of Smaritzenburg thither, to impart to the States of the Empire. Assembled there, his Imperial Majesties thoughts upon the present state of Affairs. The Fortifications that are intended to be made for the security of the Suburbs of this City, will be speedily taken in hand, the Emperour having appointed some Engineers to have the care of them. The new Levies are begun; but the Officers seem fearful they shall not be able to finish them in the time limited. Besides the 16 Regiments that are yet to be raised, it is reckoned that the Emperour has at this time on foot 66780 Men, according to the following List; Old Regiments of Foot, Grana 2040, Keiserstein 2040, Knie 2040, Old Starenberg 2040, Mansfeld 2040, Serini 2040, Stadel 2040, Goufsche 2040, Young Starenberg 2040, Baden 2040, Strasuldo 2040, Newburg 2040, Scherfenberg 2040, which together make 26920 Foot; Dragoons, Schuss 1000, Styrum 1000, together 2000; Horse, Caprata 880, Duncwalt 880, Rabbata 880, Meiternieb 880, Carassa 880, Taff 880, Merc 880, Palfi 880, Montecuculi 880, Piccolomini 880, together 8800; Croats, Ladrou 1000, Baragozzi 1500 Kery 450, together 2950; So that the old Regiments make in all 40270 Men. New Regiments of Foot, Trautmsdorf, 2040, Diepenhal 2040, Brike 2040, Ni greth 2040, Wallise 2040, Reckum 2040, Thieri 2040, Duke of Lorrain 2040, Heyster 2040, making together 13360; Dragoons, Castell 1000, Kuffenstern 1000, Serini 1000, together 3000; Horse, Jaxe Lawenburg 880, Hallelweyl 880, Gondola 880, Feteyau 880, Goty 880, together 4400; Croats, Kery 750; So that the new Regiments make 26910 Men. Besides these, the following Regiments are now raised: General Lesly 2040, Duke of Croy 2040, Count de Thun 2040, Duke of Wirtemberg 2040, Count Cuffele 2040, and a Regiment of Dragoons of 750, making together 10750 Men;

so that by this List the Emperors Forces will consist of 77530 Men.

Frankfort, Jan. 19. On Friday last parted from hence the Count de Rosenber, one of the Imperial Ambassadors for Vienna; and to Morrow his Colleague, Monsieur Straelman, likewise leaves this place, and takes his Journey for Ratisbonne. The Prince of Waldecke has been here, and has pressed these Magistrates to enter into the League concluded between the Emperour and the Circle of Franconia; but they seem not at all inclined thereunto, desiring rather to maintain a Neutrality. From Ratisbonne they write, That not only the Electoral Colledge, but likewise those of the Princes, and the Imperial Towns have resolved to Treat with Monsieur Verjus, the French Minister there; And from Vienna we have an account, That the Emperour was sending the Prince of Smaritzenburg to Ratisbonne, to negotiate matters on his Imperial Majesties behalf.

Cologne, Jan. 22. The Affairs of this City are in much disorder, through the frequent Disputes that arise between the Magistrates and the Burghers; the latter are now assembled in their several Halls, and have drawn up a Paper containing a great many Articles, which they pretend to have satisfaction in, and have delivered it to the Magistrates, with a demand of a speedy and positive Answer. The Deputies of Liege begin to speak of returning home, finding they are not able to do any good here. Our Letters from Ratisbonne of the 12 Instant, give us an account, That the Bishop of Aichstadt, the Emperors Commissioner, having communicated to the Dyet an Imperial Decree of the 29 of December, wherein his Imperial Majesty does, among other things, declare, how delicious he is that the Differences that are depending between the Empire and the Crown of France may be amicably composed, and that he is willing a Negotiation should be entered into with Monsieur Verjus, the French Minister at Ratisbonne for that purpose; The several Colledges had thereupon resolved to begin a Treaty with the said Minister accordingly.

Hamburg, Jan. 17. Our last Letters from Stockholm gave us an account, That the States Assembled there had given the King of Sweden 1200 thousand Crowns, which are to be raised immediately; and that they had promised the King a far greater supply in case of a War. The Letters add, That Count Coningsmarke was preparing for his departure for Pomeran, of which Country he is Governor for the King of Sweden, and that his Baggage was already Shipt. The Princes of Lunenburg continue to raise Men, having promised to assist the Emperour against the Turcs. The Courier that should have arrived here this day from Copenhagen, was yesterday seized upon by three Persons, and his Horse and Letters taken from him; so that we have no fresh news from that Quarter; however the general saying here is, that the Expedient which the Queen Mother of Denmark, proposed for the reconciling the Differences;
