**T**HE following Addresses of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, having been transmitted by George Earl of Morton, Knight of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle, His Majesty's Commissioner, to the Right Honourable Robert Peel, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, have been by him presented to the King; which Addresses His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously:

*May it please your Majesty,*

WE, the Members of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, have received, with sentiments of the profoundest respect and warmest gratitude, the gracious letter with which your Majesty has condescended to honour us on this occasion.

Nothing could yield us greater satisfaction and delight, than the assurance so graciously conveyed, that the conviction, which your Majesty has long entertained of our loyalty, our affection to your Majesty's Person and Government, and our zeal for the encouragement of true religion and virtue, has been improved and confirmed by the personal observation which, since our last Assembly, your Majesty had an opportunity of making during your residence in North Britain; an event which, by its happy effects on all ranks of our people, will be recorded as one of the most auspicious and memorable that ever occurred in the annals of our country. If that residence, which your Majesty is graciously pleased to call an advantage, enjoyed by none of your predecessors for a long series of years, has satisfied your Majesty more than ever of the benefits derived from the pastoral labours of the Ministers of the Church of Scotland; on our part, we may be permitted to assure your Majesty, that we also consider ourselves as fortunate beyond all who have gone before us, in the same department of public duty, by having been honoured with so

distinguished and valuable a testimony of royal approbation.

It adds inexpressibly to the gratification thus afforded us, that your Majesty feels the most entire satisfaction in continuing to countenance our meeting with your royal authority, and to assure us of your unalterable determination to maintain the Church of Scotland, in the complete enjoyment of its rights and privileges, as by law established. Suffer us accordingly now to say, that no endeavour shall be wanting on our part, to justify your Majesty's favourable opinion of our proceedings, which shall, in reliance on Divine aid, be uniformly directed to the furtherance of those great and salutary objects, for which we are assembled—the advancement of true religion, and the service of Almighty God. Encouraged and animated by the powerful motives impressed upon us by your Majesty's most acceptable letter, and in obedience to the paternal admonition which it contains, we shall do our utmost for the diffusion of the principles and practice of genuine christianity, for stemming the progress of vice, for inculcating on our hearers the necessity of strictly performing all their moral duties, and for instilling that love of order and obedience to the laws, on which the peace, harmony, and happiness of society mainly depend.

The reappointment of a Commissioner so well qualified, by his loyalty and integrity, as the Earl of Morton, to represent your Majesty in our General Assembly, is highly acceptable to us, from the personal knowledge we now have, that your Majesty's confidence in his zeal for the cause of religion, and for the prosperity of the Church of Scotland, is not misplaced, and that we shall continue to receive from his faithful services the most effectual co-operation and support, in promoting the great ends of our Assembly.

The royal donation of £2,000, for the propagation of Christian knowledge in the Highlands and Islands of Scotland, we accept with the liveliest

gratitude, as a pledge of your Majesty's anxiety to promote the extension of pure religion, and we shall apply it with all fidelity to the pious purpose for which it is bestowed.

That Almighty God may bless your Majesty, and all the Members of the Royal Family; that He may ever direct and prosper all the measures of your Majesty's Government, and that He may maintain, till the latest ages, the national blessings we now enjoy, are the fervent prayers of, may it please your Majesty, your Majesty's most faithful, most obedient, and most loyal subjects, the Ministers and Elders of this National Assembly of the Church of Scotland.
