An Act to defray the charge of the pay, cloathing, and contingent and other expenses of the disembodied militia in Great Britain and Irsland, and to grant allowances, in certain cases to subalternofficers, adjutants, quartermasters; surgeons, assistant-surgeons, surgeons"-mates, and serjeant-majors, of militia, until the twenty-fifth day of March-onethousand eight hundred and twenty-four.

An Act to continue, until the first day of Angustone, thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, an Act, made in the last session of Parliament, for suppressing insurrections, and preventing disturbances of the public peace in Ireland.

An Act to authorise in certain cases the reduction of the duties payable in Ireland, and the alteration of the duties and Frawbacks on the importation and exportation of goods between Great Britain and Ireland.

An Act for the better administration of Justice in the Court of Chancery in Ireland.

An Act to declare valid certain marriages that have been solemnized at St. Petersburgh, since the abolition of the British factory there.

An Act to allow further time for the completion of the docks and other works belonging to the London Dock Company,

And two private Acts.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to " regulate the trade between His Majesty's pos-" sessions in America and the West Indies, and " other places in America and the West Indies," it is enacted, that if His Majesty shall deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to any port or ports not enumerated in the sohedule marked A, annexed to the said Act, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to extend the provisions of the said Act to such port or ports ; His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, that from and after the passing of this Order, all articles permitted by the said Act to be imported into and exported from the ports enumerated in schedule A annexed to the said Act, shall and may be in like manner imported into and exported from the port of Old Harbour, in the island of Jamaica, on payment of the duties, and subject to the rules, regulations, penalties, and forfeitures enacted by the said Act:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
