**I**N obedience to an order of the Court of Lord  
 Mayor and Aldermen, dated the 20th day of Jan-  
 uary 1824, made in pursuance of an Act of Parli-  
 ament, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign  
 of His late Majesty King George the Third,  
 intituled " An Act for empowering the Lord Mayor,  
 Aldermen, and Commons of the city of London, in  
 Common Council assembled, to raise, upon the  
 credit of the surpluses to arise out of a certain fund  
 commonly called the Orphan's Fund, the sum of  
 £40,000, towards discharging the debt incurred in  
 rebuilding the gaol of Newgate and a sessions-  
 house adjoining; and for completing the said gaol  
 and building an infirmary thereto, and other the  
 purposes therein mentioned;" and also of another  
 Act, passed in the said year, intituled " An Act  
 for empowering the Mayor, Aldermen, and Com-  
 mons of the city of London, in Common Council  
 assembled, to make a street or opening from Moor-  
 fields, opposite Chiswell-street; towards the East,  
 into Bishopsgate-street, and also from the East end  
 of Chiswell-street Westward, into Barbican, and  
 to raise upon the credit of the surpluses to arise  
 out of a certain fund commonly called the Orphan's  
 Fund, the sum of £16,500, for such purpose;" and  
 also of a certain other Act of Parliament, made  
 and passed in the fifty-second year of His late Ma-  
 jesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act  
 for increasing the fund for watching, lighting,  
 cleansing, watering, and repairing Blackfriars-  
 bridge;" I do hereby give notice, that between the  
 hours of ten in the forenoon and two in the after-  
 noon, on the 20th day of July next ensuing, at

my Office of Chamberlain of the City of London,  
 in Guildhall, London, the principal sums of money,  
 together with all interest due on the said 20th day  
 of July next ensuing, upon the under-mentioned  
 bonds, being part of the said sums, raised by the
