"That application be made to Parliament in the ensuing session, for the repeal of the forty-sixth clause of the Act of the 53d of Geo. 3, cap. 155, by which the Court of Directors is prohibited from sending to India, in the capacity of a Writer, any person who shall not have resided during four terms at the Hayleybury College; and for introducing into the said Act a clause, appointing a public examination, at such times and under such regulations as the Court of Directors, with the approbation of the Board of Controll, may direct, to which examination all persons shall submit their acquirements and qualifications for approval, previous to their being permitted to proceed in the capacity of Writer to either of the Presidencies of Fort William, Fort St. George, or Bombay."
