The King was this day pleased to confer the honour of Knighthood on Major William Davison, Knight of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, and Aide-de-Camp and Equerry to His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge.

Whitehall, August 2, 1824.
