

Pursuant to a Decree of the High Court of Chancery, made in a Cause Green v. Wood, the Creditors of John Wood, late of Duncan-Terrace, City-Road, in the County of Middlesex, Furrier, deceased (who died in the month of March 1825), are, by their Solicitors, forthwith to come in and prove their debts before John Edmund Dowdeswell, Esq. one of the Masters of the said Court, at his Office, in Southampton-Buildings, Chancery-Lane, London, or in default thereof they will be excluded the benefit of the said Decree.
