### OFFICE OF COMMISSIONERS FOR CLAIMS ON FRANCE.

London, 19th July 1825.

THE Commissioners appointed to carry into effect the several Conventions for liquidating the Claims of British Subjects and others against the Government of France, in pursuance of the 18th section of the Act passed for the above purpose, in the fitty-moth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, baving notified, on or before the 19th day of January last, that, since the passing of the aforesaid Act of Parliament, they have liquidated, rejected, &c under Convention No. 7, eight-bundred and seventy-nine cases, and have paid 90 per Cent, out of such Sums as had been found to be due thereon, do farther, in pursuance of the said Act, give notice, that, between the said 19th day of January last and the date hereof, they have liquidated the following Claims, on which they have also issued their Certificates of 90 per Centum on the sum found to be due:

The awards of rejection on the claims of Messrs. Welch, Startin, and Co. and of Messrs. Boyd, Ker, and Co. the representatives of John Wilkinson, John Carstairs, James Carey, and Robert Pigott, have been affirmed by His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council

The arguments in the appeal before the Lords of the Council, on the case of the Catholic Ecclesiastical Establishments at Douay, were concluded on Saturday the 2d of July, but the judgment of them. Lordships has not yet been delivered.

#### CONVENTION No. 13...

Of the five awards of rejection notified as under appeal on the 19th January last, that of Mr. George Gregorie has been affirmed by His Majesty in Council; and one of those entered by the creditors of Messrs. Law and Chevalier has been abandoned by the appellants, so that only three appeals under this Convention remain still pending before His Majesty in Council, and of these three, that of George Keith and Co. has been partly heard.

The claims now notified as adjudicated since the 19th of January last, together with thisse before liquidated, rejected, &c. as notified in preceding Gazettes, make a total of 1654 claims, under the two Conventions, liquidated, rejected, &c. since the 19th May 1819, when the Act was passed empowering the Commissioners to liquidate in England.
