

Pursuant to a Decree of the High Court of Chancery, made in a Cause *Plummer v. Selby*, the Heir at Law of William Hudson, late of Stoke-Newington, in the County of Middlesex, and of Cow-Lane, in the City of London, Ironmonger (who died on or about the 20th day of February 1820), and also the Next of Kin of the said William Hudson, who were living at the time of his death, and the personal representative or representatives of any of such Next of Kin who have since died, are, by their Solicitors, to come in and prove their descent and kindred, and make out their claims, before James Trower, Esq. one of the Masters of the said Court, at his Chambers, in Southampton-Buildings, Chancery-Lane, London, on or before the 10th day of November 1825, or in default thereof they will be peremptorily excluded the benefit of the said Decree.

Pursuant to a Decree of the High Court of Chancery, made in a Cause wherein George Sharp is the plaintiff, and Martha Erat, Widow, and others are defendants, the Creditors of Jacob Erat, late of Berner's-Street, Oxford-Street, in the Parish of Saint Mary-le-Bone, in the County of Middlesex, Harp-Maker (who died in the month of March 1821), are forthwith to come in and prove their debts before Francis Paul Stratford, Esq. one of the Masters of the said Court, at his Chambers, in Southampton-Buildings, Chancery-Lane, London, or in default thereof they will be excluded the benefit of the said Decree.
