And all Mayors, Justices, Coroners, and other Officers, before whom any inquisitions, informations, examinations, or recognizances may have been taken touching any such offences, are required to transmit the same forthwith to Mr. Thomas Shelton, the Clerk of Arraignment of the High Court of Admiralty of England, at his Office, at the Sessions-House, in the Old Bailey, London.
