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Warsaw, April 27.

THe great meeting of the Senate (which is called *Senatus Concilium*, and always follows the Dyet) ended on Friday last. It was there resolved, That a Body of Foot should be forthwith raised, and a Train of Artillery provided; That the City of *Cracaw* should be fortified; That Envoys should be sent to *Moscovy*, to the Tartars, the Cossacks, and to Count *Tockeley*, and that the Resident of this Crown at the Port should be called home, &c. The Imperial Ambassador, *Charles Count Wallenstein*, parted from hence on Monday last in his return to *Vienna*; but the Baron *de Cracaw*, Ambassador from the Elector of *Brandenburg*, continues still here. We have advice, That the Tartars are together in a great Body on the side of *Caminiec*, to observe the motions of this Crown. A great Council of War is now held here.

Milan, April 28. On Monday last our Governour the Count *de Melgar* parted from hence for *Pavia*, intending to go likewise to *Tortona* and *Alexandria*, to visit the Fortifications of those places, and to take a review of the Troops in Garrison there; Monsieur *de Louvigny*, our *Majstre de Camp* General, and other the principal Officers of the Army, went thither some days before to give the necessary Orders against his Excellency's arrival. Our Letters from *France* tell us, That the Most Christian King will have a Camp towards *Italy* this Summer. The *Genoueses*, as our Advices tell us, have great Apprehensions of the French; they have not only put their new Gallies to Sea, but have likewise resolved to build six more; and the French Resident has thereupon acquainted the Senate, That the King his Master has given Orders to his Ships of War to attack and sink the said Gallies if they meet them at Sea. They write from *Turin*, That the Prince of *Savoy* was arrived there from *Brussels*, and that it was said he would suddenly return to *Germany*, where he has lately raised a Regiment of Dragoons for the Emperor's Service.

Presbourg, May 3. On Wednesday last in the Evening their Imperial Majesties, accompanied with the Archdutchess and the Elector of *Bavaria*, arrived here, and were received with all the Solemnity that this place was capable of. The next Morning very early they went to the Rendezvous; their Imperial Majesties arrived there about 2 o'Clock; and found the Army drawn up in Battalia in two Lines, (which were a good *Hungarian* Mile in length) and 80 Pieces of Cannon placed at the head of it: About 11 the Archbishop of *Sirigonia* sung Mass under a Tent set up for

that purpose, where was prepared a place for their Imperial Majesties, covered with Cloth of Gold, and behind them another for the Arch-Dutchess, and behind her a third for the Elector of *Bavaria* and the Duke of *Lorraine*: After Mass, the Archbishop came from under the Tent, and Bless the whole Army; and then the Emperor mounted on Horseback, and being followed by the Empress, the Archdutchess, and the Elector, &c. visited all the Ranks, which done, the Duke of *Lorraine* entertained their Imperial Majesties, the Archdutchess, the Elector of *Bavaria*, the Duke of *Saxe-Lawenburg*, and Prince *Louis* of *Baden*, at Dinner, under a very rich Tent, several other Tables being prepared for the Nobility that attended their Imperial Majesties. In the mean time the Cannon was thrice discharged, and the whole Army (to whom the Emperor has given a Months Pay as a free Gift) gave three Salvo's. In the Evening their Imperial Majesties returned hither, and it's said the Army will d'camp the 11th Instant.

Vienna, May 7. Their Imperial Majesties, with the Archdutchess and the Elector of *Bavaria*, arrived at *Presbourg* the fifth Instant, and the next day the General Rendezvous was to be held not far from thence. Besides the Train of Artillery which is now with the Army, 12 Half-Cannon, and eight great Mortar-Pieces were two days agoe taken out of the Arsenal, and sent for *Hungary*, which makes People think they intend to Attack some place. There are Letters from *Croatia* which Inform us, That one of that Nation having put himself into the Service of the Turks at *Ziget*, and insinuated himself into their Confidence, he at last put the design he had, which was to set Fire to their Magazine, in Execution, and having succeeded in it, escaped into *Croatia*; We are told the Turks had a Magazine there that might maintain 30000 Men two Years, which these Letters say is quite burnt, and great part of the Fortifications of *Ziget* blown up, and 500 Turks killed. From *Warsaw* they write, That the King of *Poland* is endeavouring an Accommodation between the Emperor and the Hungarian Rebels, and that in order thereunto he is sending an Envoy to Count *Tockeley*. We have not as yet any certain advice of the Grand-Signior's Arrival at *Belgrade*.

Vienna, May 9. We have an account from *Presbourg*, That the General Rendezvous was held the sixth Instant in the Plains near that City; The Emperor was four Hours on Horseback to view the Army, which with the *Hungarian* Troops that were there, is said to amount to between 40 and 50 Thousand Men, and besides several Regiments were not yet come up; the Train of Artillery consisted of 80 Pieces of Cannon, besides Mortar Pieces. Before the Rendezvous the Duke of *Lorraine* was to visit *Raab* and *Comorra*, and we are told he has designed a Camp between those two places.
