THE King has been pleased to give and grant unto John Pistor, of the city of Bath, in the county of Somerset, Esq. and unto Elizabeth Worthington, of Lansdowne-crescent, in the same city, spinster, one of the daughters and coheirresses of Charles Worthington, late of Lansdowne-crescent aforesaid, Esq. deceased, His royal licence and authority, that from and immediately after the solemnization of their intended marriage, they may, out of affectionate respect and regard to the memory of the said Charles Worthington, and in compliance with a wish often expressed by him during his lifetime, assume and from thenceforth use the surname of Worthington only, instead of that of Pistor; that the said John Pistor may likewise take and bear the arms of Worthington; and that the said surname and arms may also be borne and used by the issue of their said intended marriage; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office, otherwise His Majesty's said royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to order, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.
