The King has been pleased to give and grant unto Robert Riddell, of Caverse, in the shire of Roxburgh, Esq. a Captain in the Royal Navy, His Majesty's royal licence and authority, that he and his issue may henceforth assume and use the surname of Carre, in addition to his present surname of Riddell, and bear the arms of Carre quarterly with those of Riddell (Carre in the first quarter), in compliance with a clause contained in a deed of disposition made by Alexander Carre, late of Caverse aforesaid, Esq. deceased, bearing date the 14th September 1802; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office, otherwise His Majesty's said licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to order, that the said royal concession and declaration be recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms.

WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto the King, that, in the night of Monday the 12th of June instant, a barn, part of Sudell's tenement, in the township of Billington, in the county of Lancaster, the property of George Petre, Esq. and in the occupation of James Seed, the overseer of the poor of Billington, was maliciously set on fire and totally destroyed, together with a cart, various implements of husbandry, and three calves;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the felony above mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually set fire to the said barn), who shall discover his accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
