**N**OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session, for leave to bring in a Bill for altering, explaining, amending, enlarging, and extending the powers of seven several Acts of Parliament, made and passed respectively in the fifty-first, fifty-third, fifty-sixth, and fifty-eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, and the first, fourth, and fifth years of the reign of His present Majesty, for vesting certain powers and authorities in the Southwark-bridge Company, and, amongst other things, to exonerate the said bridge from poor and other rates; and to enable the said Company, if they shall think fit, and with the consent of the Trustees of the Surrey and Sussex Roads, acting under and by virtue of two several Acts of Parliament, passed in the forty-second and fifty-eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, to give up to the said Trustees, and the said Trustees to take the controul, superintendance, and management of so much of the road leading from the Southwark-bridge to Newington-causeway, as does not lie within the manor of Southwark, otherwise called the Clink or Bishop of Winchester's Liberty, with power for the said Trustees to erect one or more toll-gate or toll-gates on the said road, and to take the same tolls as are now payable or taken by virtue of the said last-mentioned Acts on the roads therein described, and an additional toll in the event of the said Trustees paving the said road; and also to enable the said Company to take and purchase houses, ground, and hereditaments, on the east side of Queen-street, in the city of London, with the consent of the owners and proprietors thereof, for the purpose of widening the said street.
