WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to
the King, that between eleven and twelve
o'clock in the night of Sunday the 5th instant, James
Forster, a seaman of His Majesty's ship *Hyperion*,
which is stationed on the coast of Sussex for the
prevention of smuggling, being on his duty as a
sentinel at the Blackhorse-lane, near East Elmer, in

the said county, was attacked by a party of men con-
cealed behind a wall, who pelted him with stones,
one of which having struck him on the face and
brought him to the ground, three of the said party
advanced upon him, seized him, dragged him into
the lane, and there with a knife cut off part of his
right ear, broke two of his fingers, made several
stabs at him through his clothes, and attempted to
cut his throat, which was prevented by his getting
his hand to his pistol and firing an alarm, on which
they made off and escaped;

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bring-
ing to justice the offenders concerned in this
atrocious felony, is hereby pleased to promise his
most gracious pardon to any one of the said offen-
ders (except those who actually wounded the said
James Forster) who shall make known his accom-
plices therein, so that they may be apprehended.
