T the Court at St. James's, the 20th of November 1826,

#### PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS the time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the third of May last, for prohibiting the exportation of gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or amnumition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar), has expired; and whereas it is judged expedient that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons what-soever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service), do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the date of this Order), presume to transport any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar) or ship or lade any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammuuition, on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf, first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Second, intituled "An Act " to empower His Majesty to prohibit the expor-" tation of gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammunition, and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying coastwise of salt-petre,

by the Clerk of the Pence, Town Ched " gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammu-" nition;" and also by an Act, passed in the thirtythird year of His late Majesty's reign, cap. 2, intituled " An Act to enable His Majesty to " restrain the exportation of naval stores, and " more effectually to prevent the exportation of salt-petre, arms, and ammunition, when pre" hibited by Proclamation or Order in Council:"
