

The under-mentioned Lieutenants, actually serving upon full-pay in Regiments of the Line, whose commissions are dated in or previous to the year 1811, have accepted promotion upon half-pay, according to the General Order of the 27th December 1826:

To be Captains of Infantry.

Lieutenant Robert Robson, from the 26th Foot. Dated 27th March 1827.

Lieutenant Frederick Childley Irwin, from the 45th Foot. Dated 27th March 1827.

STAFF.

Brevet Major John Gurwood, of the 19th Foot, to be Deputy Adjutant-General to the Forces serving in the Windward and Leeward Islands (with the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel in the Army), vice Berkeley, who resigns. Dated 15th March 1827.

HOSPITAL STAFF.

Staff-Surgeon Donald Macleod, from the half-pay, to be Surgeon to the Forces. Dated 15th March 1827.

Robert Macara, Gent. to be Hospital-Assistant to the Forces, vice Watson, appointed to the 83d Foot. Dated 8th March 1827.

MEMORANDA.

The promotion of Ensign Bedford to be Lieutenant in the 1st Foot, was vice Kerr, promoted, and not vice Macpherson, promoted, as formerly stated.

The name of the Gentleman appointed to an Unattached Ensigncy on 13th March 1827, is William Bramley, and not Bromley, as formerly stated.

Lieutenant Charles William Davis, half-pay 6th Irish Brigade. Dated 27th March 1827.

The date of the appointment of Lieutenant Charles Montagu Burrows to the Royal African Colonial Corps, has been altered to 23th June 1824, with the view of placing him in his original situation in that Corps, between Lieutenants Patterson and Burlton.

The commission of Ensign Hew Manners Dalrymple, of the 1st Foot, has been antedated to 4th November 1825, but he has not been allowed any back-pay.

The commissions of Captains Aitchison and Ashe, of the Cape Infantry, have been antedated, the former to the 25th October 1819, and the latter to 11th May 1826, to place them in their original situations in that Corps.

The King has been pleased to give and grant unto Sir Harry Calvert, of Middle Claydon-house, in the county of Buckingham, Bart. a Captain in the Army, and Lieutenant and Captain in His Majesty's 1st or Grenadier Regiment of Foot Guards (eldest son and heir of the late Sir Harry Calvert, Bart. Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, and of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, a General in the Army, Colonel of the 14th (or the Buckinghamshire) Regiment of Foot, and Lieutenant-Governor of Chelsea-Hospital, deceased), His royal licence and permission, that he and his issue may, in compliance with a clause contained in the last will and testament of Catherine Verney, widow and relict of the Reverend Robert Verney, Clerk, Master of Arts, Rector of Middle Claydon, in the said county, deceased, and uterine sister of the late Right Honourable Mary Verney, Baroness Fermagh, in Ireland, also deceased, take and use the surname of Verney, instead of that of Calvert, and bear the arms of Verney, quarterly with those of Calvert; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office; otherwise the said licence and permission to be void and of none effect.

And also to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

WHEREAS by indenture, bearing date the 21st day of May, in the year 1750, Elizabeth Jones and the Rev. Charles Jones, did grant and demise unto the Right Honourable Lord Bexon Mornington, Chichester Fortescue, Samuel Bridges, and Theobald Wolfe, that plot of ground on the north side of Lazors-hill, now Townsend-street, whereon the Westmorland Lock Hospital has since been erected, being in the county of the city of Dublin, to have and to hold unto them and the survivors and survivor of them, his heirs and assigns, for three lives therein named, with a covenant for perpetual renewal, at and under the rent and fines therein specified; and whereas by deed of renewal, made 3d January 1752, by and between the same parties, the life of the Honourable Garrett Wesely was substituted in place of that of His Royal Highness Frederick Prince of Wales, then late deceased, one of the lives named in said lease; and whereas all the said lessees and lives in said lease and renewal are long since dead, and the representatives or heirs or assigns of said lessees have not obtained a further renewal of said lease; and whereas all the right and interest of said lessors in and to the said premises is now vested in me, the undersigned; and whereas I have demanded on the said premises all arrears of fines and rent due out of said premises, pursuant to the Statute in such case made and pre-
