

Whitehall, June 19, 1827.

**W**HEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto the King, that, on the night of the 1st of June instant, some evil-disposed person or persons stabbed, and thereby killed, a horse, the property of one William Bray, a carrier, of Redditch, in the county of Worcester; and to one of the horses legs was tied an anonymous letter, threatening the life of the said William Bray;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the felonies above mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually stabbed the horse, and the writer of the said letter) who shall discover his accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further encouragement, a reward of FORTY GUINEAS is hereby offered by the Minister, Chapelwardens, and several inhabitants of Redditch, and TEN GUINEAS by the Redditch Association for the Prosecution of Felons, to any person concerned in killing the said horse (except the person who stabbed the same) who shall discover the said offender or offenders, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted of the said offence.
