was entred the Town, and had given immediate Orders for burning the Suburb: The Emperour has fent the Baron de Gorz to the filhops of Bamberg and Wirtzbourg, to caule the Troops of the Circle of Franconia, (whereof they are Directors) to march immediately to his affiltance against the Turks.

Vienna, July 11. So great are the Cruelties which the Turks use wherefoever they come, that several places in Hungary, to fecure themfelves against fo barbarous a Treatment, have voluntarily Surrendred to them. It is faid, That the Enemy, after having burned a finall Village called Petronello, have quitted the Siege of Raab. We fuddenly expect 4000 Men from Bobemia, and 7000 from Bavaria, as well for the defence of this place, as the reinforcement of the Army. The Prince of Savoy is dead of the Wounds which he received in the late Action, as is likewife the Prince of Aremberg. Major General Schurz has defeated a confiderable body of the Rebels, who endeavoured to pass the Danube near Marchfelt. It is faid, That the Emperor will semove in a thort time from Lintz to Prague.

Hague July 15. The States of Holland and Weft Friefland arc Alfembled here, but intend to feparate themselves on Monday next, and at the fame time his Highness the Prince of Orange proposes to depart towards the Veluwe, and from thence to go and visit the Fortifications of Breda, Maestricht, and Grave. In the mean time Collonel Hofwegben has teccived Orders to repair to Berghenopzuom, of which place he is Governor. We have advice from Munich, That the Heer Valkenier was arrived there, but we have not as yet, received any account of the progress of his Negotiation with the Elector of Ba-The Deputies which the States appointed vstria. to fee in what readinefs their Fleet which lies in the Texel is, have made their Report unto them, and it is faid, That the next year 12 Men of War, carrying between 70 and 80 Canons, and 50 and 60, will be added to the number which are at prefent equipped.

Hague July 23. The States General are still Affembled, but will Adjourn themselves about the latter end of this Month. Our Letters from Germany fay, That a great part of the Town of Gran, as alfo the Caffle and Magazine were blown up, but by what accident it was occasioned, is not known. In the mean time the Grand Visier has fent two Baffa's thicher, to give him an account of the damage which the place has fulfained.

Paris, July 24. The fourth inflant Monfieur du Quefne arrived at the Islands of Fromentieres, and having joyned the Galliots and the Galleys, failed the rath instant for Algiers, where being reinforced with a Squadron of Men of War, under the Command of the Marquis d' Amfreville, he gave the neceffary Orders for the intended Attack, and the 26th at mid ight threw 86 Bombs, which did great damage to the Mole, and the Houles adjoyning to it: Not were the Algierines wanting in making a fuitable Return from the Ordnauce they had planted upon the Port, though without doing any planted upon the Port, though without doing any confiderable Execution. The 27th, Monfieur du Luefne threw 110 Bombs into the place, which did great Execution, and were asfwered with many difcharges from the Cannon, in which we loft the Sieur de Choifeal and two Souldiers. The 28th, Bobba Haffa fent a Deputy to Monfieur du Luefne, to defire a Peace of him, in the name of the Divan;

who told him, That he could not accept ary Pro politions of that Nature, until all the Subjects of the King his Mafter, as well as all those of other Nations, who had been taken in French Ships, were reftored unto him; which was accordingly performed that Evening : With a defire from the Governour to Monfieur du Quefne, that he would forbear all further thooting into the City; which was likewise granted; and in pursuance of this Promise, the 25th instant, the Divan restored to Monsteur du Ruestne 141 Captives, among whom is the Sieur de Beaujeu, Captain of a Man of War, who informcd us of the great damage our Mortar-Pieces had done unto the Town, and the general confidentation under which the Inhabitants were. The 30th, Monsieur du Luesne received 180 more Captives, and the first of Fuly 150, with a request from the Governour, to reflore those Algierines, which had been lately taken by the Chevalier de Lety, to which, neverthele(s. Monfieur du Quefne did not think fit to confert. The fecond inflant we recei-yed 83 more from Algiers, and have reftored to us fince than 146 Captives.
