PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

IT is this day ordered by His Majesty in Council, that the Parliament, which was to meet on Tuesday the twenty-second day of this instant January, be further prorogued to Tuesday the twenty-ninth day of the said month, then to meet for the dispatch of business: And the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain is to cause a commission to be prepared in the usual manner for proroguing the Parliament accordingly.

AT the Court at *Windsor*, the 18th day of *October* 1827,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the twenty-third of May last, for prohibiting the exportation of gun-powder, salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar), will expire on the twenty-third day of November next; and whereas it is judged expedient that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer; His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, and command, that no person or persons whatever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for

His Majesty's Service), do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the twenty-third of November next), presume to transport any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar) or ship or lade any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, for the transporting of the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties imposed in that behalf by an Act, passed in the sixth year of His present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the general regulation of the Customs."

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Royal Highness the Lord High Admiral, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that in the night of Thursday the 3d instant, a large party of smugglers, to the number of upwards of two hundred, armed with fire arms and other offensive weapons, feloniously assembled on the sea shore at Galley-hill, near Bexhill, in the county of Sussex, and were aiding and assisting in the illegal landing, running, and carrying away of uncustomed goods; that in opposing this felonious act, and in seizing part of the said goods, Charles Collins, a first rate quartermaster of His Majesty's ship Hyperion, was killed, and others of the said ship wounded; and that upon an inquisition held on the body of the said Charles Collins, the jury have returned a verdict of wilful murder against persons unknown;

His Majesty, for the better discovering the persons who have been guilty of this felony and murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one or more of the persons so assembled (except those who actually committed violence on the said Charles Collins or any of the Officers or men of the Hyperion on this occasion), who shall discover his accomplices, so that they may be apprehended and brought to justice.

And His Royal Highness the Lord High Admiral is pleased to direct, that a reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS shall be paid and distributed to and amongst any persons (except as aforesaid) who shall give such information to Captain Mingaye, or any of the Officers of the Hyperion, as shall lead to the discovery, apprehension, and conviction of the said offenders.—Such reward to be paid by Mr. Charles Jones, the Solicitor of the Admiralty and Navy, on conviction of the said offenders, or any of them.

WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto the King, that, on Thursday the 20th of December last, about six o'clock in the evening, a fire broke out in the premises of Mrs. Blick, of Longbridge, in the borough of Warwick, which consumed a barley rick, a wheat rick, two hay ricks, part of a stack of hay and straw, with all the barns and hovels adjoining; and whereas it hath been also represented to the King, that, on Saturday night the 22d, or early on Sunday morning the 23d day of December last, a fire broke out on the premises of Mr. William Baylies, of Welford, in the county of Gloucester, which consumed five wheat ricks, a bean rick, a hay rick, a straw rick, part of a barn, a granary, and a cow-shed; and whereas it hath been further represented unto the King, that, on the 1st of January instant, a fire broke out in the rick-yard of Mr. John Baldwin, of the parish of Alveston, near Stratford-upon-Avon, in the county of Warwick, and destroyed property therein; and that there is every reason to believe, that the several fires before mentioned were the act of some evil-disposed person or persons unknown;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the felonies above mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person or persons who actually set fire to the said respective premises) who shall discover their accomplice or accomplices therein; so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

THE following is the copy of an Order in Council, approving of a district being assigned to the new chapel built at Tyldesley, in the parish of Leigh, in the county of Lancaster:

At the Court at Windsor, the 16th of November 1827, present, the King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the 58th year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes," it is amongst other things enacted, "that in every case in which the

Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act, shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the Bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated; signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto, under his hand and seal, and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe lands, tithes, moduses, or other endowments, which will by such division arise and accrue and remain to be within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value, or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits, which arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if thereupon His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;” And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted “ that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete separate and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the Bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary, for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendance of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division:” And whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to His Majesty in Council, stating that the parish of Leigh, in the county of Lancaster, and diocese of Chester, in the year 1821, contained a

population of eighteen thousand three hundred and seventy-two persons, which has since considerably increased; that the parish is divided into the townships of West Leigh, Pennington, Bedford, Atherton, Astley, and Tyldesley-cum-Shackerley; the parish church and two chapels being the only consecrated places of worship in the parish, and affording church accommodation for four thousand one hundred and thirteen persons; that a chapel has been erected in the township of Tyldesley, containing a population of four thousand three hundred and twenty-five persons, which chapel is capable of accommodating one thousand four hundred and thirty-seven persons, three hundred and five being in pews, and the remainder in free sittings for the use of the poor; that the said chapel has been consecrated and Divine Service performed regularly therein; that the said Commissioners, for the better carrying into effect the objects which they had in view, in causing such chapel to be erected, have deemed it expedient that the township of Tyldesley-cum-Shackerley should be assigned as a district to the new chapel, under the provisions of the 21st section of the before-mentioned Act; the boundaries thereof to commence at what is commonly called Green-Field, proceeding about a mile southward down the side of a brook crossing the highway leading from Manchester to Wigan, at Hindsforth-Bridge, continuing in a south westerly direction down the side of the same brook to the north of print works, belonging to George Ormerod, Esq. to Fulwell-House, and taking a southerly direction along the side of a quick-thorn hedge across the Bridle-Road, leading from Tyldesley to Leigh, and onward to Swanns-Leech, then turning to the left and taking an easterly direction proceeding about two miles and a half through Bank-House-Meanleys and Daus-House, and crossing the highway leading from Tyldesley to Astley, and Manchester to Leigh, and turning to the left proceeding in a north easterly direction to Stirrup-Brook. That the consent of the Lord Bishop of the diocese to the proposed division has been obtained, as required by the 25th section of the said Act. That the said Commissioners beg leave, therefore, to lay before His Majesty the before-mentioned circumstances, and humbly pray that His Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into his royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to His Majesty in his wisdom shall seem meet. His Majesty having taken the said representation into consideration, is thereupon pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed division be accordingly made and effected agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

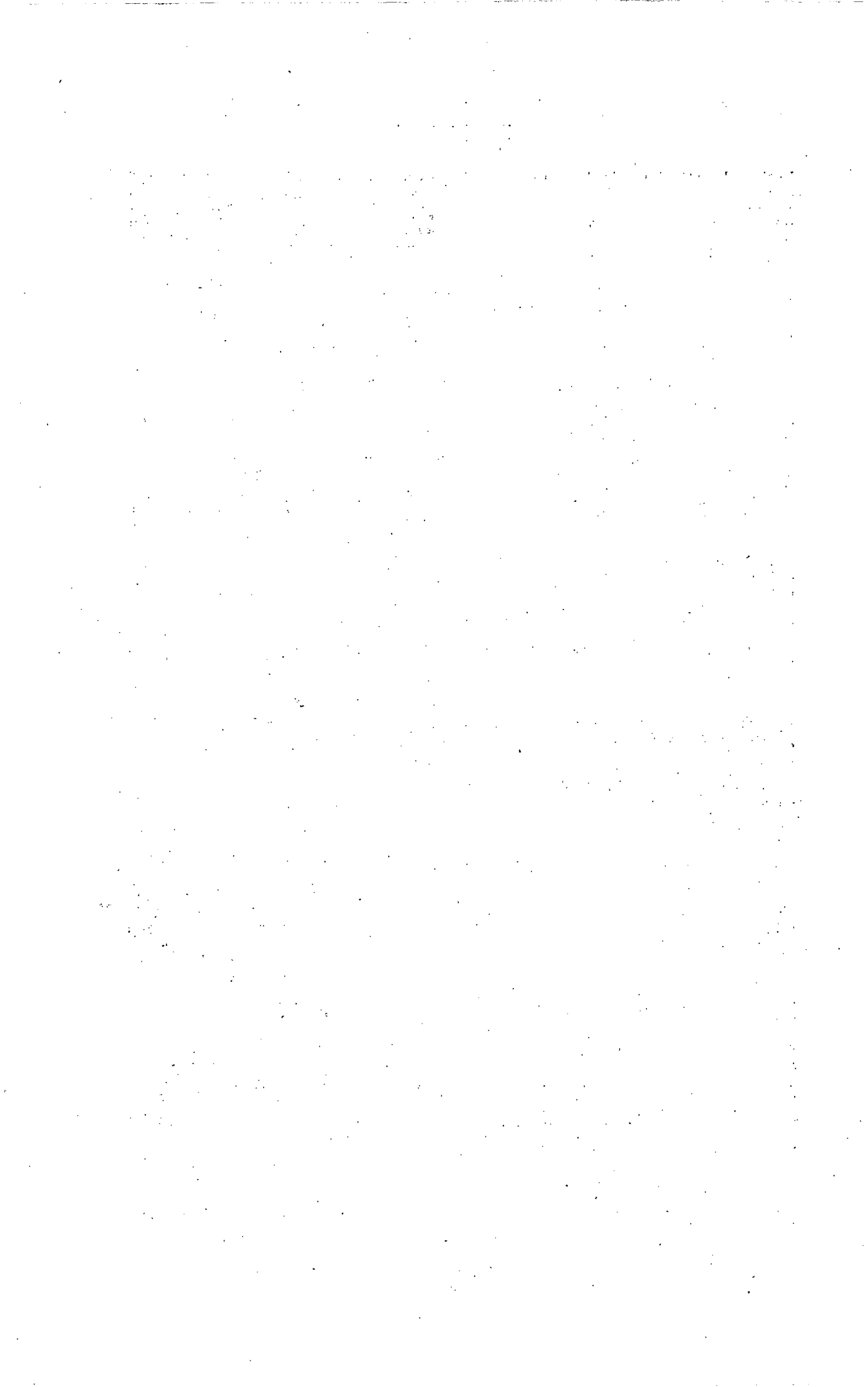
