The humble Address of the Mayor, Magistrates, and Common Council of Your Ancient Borough of Plymouth, in publick Sessions at the Guild-Hall, July 12. 1683. then and there Assembled.

Most Dread and Gracious Sovereign,

WE having lately received by Your Majesty's Proclamations, the certainty of a most Horrid and execrable Conspiracy against the Life of Your Sacred Majesty, and Your dearest and most Illustrious Brother, by ill-affected and desperate Persons: We cannot express the Astonishment with which we are struck at the report of so great a Villany, and we cannot yet reflect upon the dismal Mischiefs which would have been the Effect of it without Amazement: And having paid our most humble and thankful acknowledgments for the Divine Providence, by which this Hellish Design was prevented; We thought our selves obliged to declare our abhorrence of it, and of all Traiterous Associations and Attempts against Your Majesty's Person and Government Established in Church and State.

And being deeply sensible not only of the many years of Peace and Happiness, we have enjoyed under Your Majesty's most mild and just Government, but also of the Glorious and Flourishing State of these Kingdoms under Your Royal Ancestors: We cannot but judge Your Royal Family is raised and supported by the Divine Providence, to be a peculiar Blessing to us and our Posterity.

And therefore we equally detest these Attempts for the Destruction of Your Sacred Person, and all others for the Exclusion of Your Heirs and Successors.

And we most humbly intreat Your Sacred Majesty to accept of this profession of our Loyalty, with all Sincerity, assuring Your Majesty, that what we have subscribed with our Hands, we will (when ever Your Majesty's Service and Safety requires it) seal with our Blood.

May it please Your Majesty,

WE Your Majesties most Dutiful and Loyal Subjects the Mayor, Steward, Bayliffs, Burgesses, Minister, and other Gentlemen and Inhabitants of the Borough of New-Window, Berks, reflecting with Horror upon the late Diabolical Conspiracy, formed and contrived by Men of Republican Principles, under the specious Pretence of Religion, viz. Seditious Preachers and Schismatical Absenters from the Church, both known Enemies to Monarchy, and both influenced by a late Traiterous Association, to destroy Your Majesties Sacred Person, and Your Dearest Brother James Duke of York.

Do in the deepest Gratitude of our Souls to Almighty God, and in a continued Testimony of our Loyalty and bounden Duty to Your Sacred Majesty, Your Lawful Heirs and Successors, congratulate Your Majesties most happy Deliverance from this cursed Conspiracy, and offer the humble Sacrifice of our Lives and Fortunes, with the Zeal that ever shall be more peculiar to our selves, from the particular Honor and Advantages Your Majesty has been graciously pleased to afford us by Your Royal Presence.

And we shall likewise ever pray, that Almighty God, who has from time to time miraculously preserved Your most Sacred Majesty, would still defeat the Devices and Attempts of the Enemies of the Crown, and the present Government both in Church and State; and that now at last he would open their Eyes to see their Horrid Ingratitude, and to joya with us in the utmost assurances of a most firm Fidelity to Your Majesty and the Royal Line in the Legal Descent; as also in our Prayers that Your Majesty may enjoy a long and prosperous and Triumphant Reign.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE Your Majesties most Loyal and Obedient Subjects, Your Majesties Justices of the Peace, Grand Jury, and others present at the Sessions held at Bodmin for Your Majesties most Loyal County of Cornwall, having with Horror and Astonishment received an Assurance of a most damnable and Traiterous Conspiracy against the Life of Your Sacred Majesty, and Dearest Brother James Duke of York: A Conspiracy manifestly tending to the Subversion of the best Religion and Government in the World, do render our most humble and hearty thanks to Almighty God, who hath thus graciously and often miraculously preserved Your Majesty, beseeching him still to deliver You, and insinuate the Counsels, and Confound the Machinations of all Your Enemies. Having formerly experienced Your Majesties most gracious Condescension, in accepting the Loyal Addresses of Your Dutiful Subjects, we humbly presume to declare our utter Abhorrence and Detestation of all Traiterous Conspiracies and Associations, and our firm Resolutions to use our utmost Industry in discovering and defeating the same; And that we shall be always ready with that Zeal and Affect in our Duty and Religion doth oblige to expose our Lives and Fortunes in defence of Your Majesties Sacred Person, Your Heirs and Lawful Successors, and the Government now by Law established in Church and State.

Madrid July 22. The 12th instant the Spanish Fleet, consisting of two and twenty Men of War, sailed from Cadix. We have advice by a Vessel arrived at the Groyne from the West Indies, That the New Spain Fleet which sailed from Cadix in March last, was, after a troublesome passage, arrived late at Puerto Rico.

Genoa July 21. This day sailed from hence the Friendship and the Four Brothers for Alicanti and Cadix, being very richly laden. Some days ago a Brigantine belonging to Arassia, met off of Sardinia with a Turkish Brigantine, mounted with 32 Guns, which after an obstinate fight they took, and this day brought in hither.

Ratisbonne, July 20. The Bishop of Aichstadt, the Imperial Commissioner, hath by a late Memorial, represented unto the Diet, the imminent danger in which Vienna and the whole Circle of Austria is at present in, and hath in the Emperor's name demanded an immediate assistance of Men, to prevent the further progress of the Turks. This day six Companies of Foot belonging to the Elector of Bavaria, passed through this place, on their way to Straubing, where they will arrive to-morrow, and are followed with several Troops of Horse, which are to Rendezvous at Scherding, and the Troops of the Circle of Bavaria at Braune.

Ratisbonne, July 21. The Elector of Bavaria's Troops are assembled at the place appointed for their Rendezvous, and will suddenly march to join the Imperial Army, in order to the raising the Siege of Vienna. The Emperor continues still at Passaw, and it is uncertain whether he will remove hither, or not.

Breslaw, July 28. Yesterday arrived here a Courier from Vienna, who says, That the besieged make a very vigorous defence, and that as yet they are under no want either of Provisions or Ammunition. We have advice from Upper Silesia, That the Rebels have taken and plundered Budekm, six miles from Silaine, which has put the Inhabitants of this place in great apprehensions of receiving the like treatment from them suddenly.

Passaw, July 26. The consternation which the Siege of Vienna does occasion in these parts cannot easily be expressed; according to all our advices the Grand Visier does very much press it, having made several attacks, in which he does not spare his
