WE your Majesties most dutiful and Loyal Subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, Common-Council, Bayliffs and Burgesses of Cambridge, having with Horror and Amazement heard of a most wicked and detestable Conspiracy, contrived and entered into by Factious and Schismatical Persons, for the Compassing the Deaths of your Sacred Majesty, and his Royal Highness your Dear Brother, and the Subverting the Government now by Law established, do with all Thankfulness and Joy acknowledge the Divine Mercy and Favour by a signal Providence, disappointing and discovering the Authors and Actors in that Horrid Conspiracy, to their just Punishment, and the eternal Reproach and Infamy of them, and all their Factious Abettors.

And, Dread Sir, with great Humility we crave leave to assure your Majesty, That as we shall daily offer up our sincere and fervent Prayers unto Almighty God, by whom Kings Reign, shall to protect and defend your sacred and beloved Life, from all the wicked Attempts and Practices of the Enemies of your Person and Government. So will we ever stand firm in this Loyal Resolution, (as in duty bound) to adventure our Lives and Fortunes for the Defence of your Sacred Person, your Heirs and lawful Successors, and the Government in Church and State, as now by Law established, against all Traiterous Associations and Treasonable Attempts whatsoever. By the Gracious Providence of Almighty God, have been lately brought to light and discovered.

All which Damnable Plots, Conspiracies, and Associations, we do most heartily and sincerely detest and abhor, and will

not cease to implore Almighty God, that the same may be yet more fully detected and brought to light, that to the Disturbers of your Majesties Government, and our Peace, may receive due Punishment.

And we most humbly crave leave, to assure your Sacred Majesty; (that as we are in duty bound) so we are unanimously resolved; to bear true Allegiance and Obedience to your Sacred Majesty, your Heirs and lawful Successors, and to assist your Sacred Majesty with our Lives and Fortunes, together with all that is near and dear unto us, in the Defence of your Royal Person and Government, both in Church and State, as by Law is established.

To which we most Humbly add our daily Prayers, that Almighty God will be pleased of his infinite Goodness, to Grant your Sacred Majesty a long and prosperous Reign over us, to unite the Hearts of all Your Majesties Subjects, truly to Honour and Obey your Sacred Majesty as our Sovereign, and to Confound all the Hellish and Wicked Plots and Conspiracies of all your Majesties Enemies, against your Royal Person and Government.

### To the King's Most Excellent Majesty.

The humble Address of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Chichester in Common Council Assembled, as well upon the Unanimous Presentation, and Subscriptions of the Grand Jury and Justices of the Peace, as all the rest of the Inhabitants of the said City, at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace in the Guild-Hall, held there the Twelfth day of this instant July, and Sealed with the Common Seal of the said City, in the Five and thirtieth Year of Your Majesty's Reign.

#### Most Dread Sovereign,

WE Your most Loyal and Dutiful Subjects, Having with great Horror and Amazement, taken notice of a most Hellish and Bloody Conspiracy, contrived and carried on against your most Sacred Person and Dearest Brother, by the Devilish Joyned Consultations of sturdy Conventurers and other Atheistical Persons, thereby to Involve your Kingdoms in Blood and Confusion, and utterly to destroy the best Religion and Government in the World.

Do in the first place render unto Almighty God our most hearty and unfeigned Thanks for discovering and preventing this their damnable Conspiracy, praying that the same Miraculous Providence may for ever guard and defend your sacred Person and Throne.

And we do withal assure your Majesty that we shall be always ready with our best endeavours, and to our utmost powers (as in Duty bound) to disclose and make known all Treasons and Traiterous Conspiracies, and to bring the Authors of them to condign Punishment, and with our Lives and Fortunes from time to time assist and defend your Royal Person, State and Government, and your Lawful Heirs and Successors, against all Plots, Covenants, Associations, Conspiracies and Treasonable Practices whatsoever.

Dantzicke, August 7. The King of Poland uses all the diligence he can to draw his Forces together, being resolved to march in Person to the relief of Vienna; In order whereunto he arrived the 29. past, at Cracaw, after having been to perform his Devotions at Crankoshow.

From the Imperial Camp near Presbourg, August 1. The Duke of Lorraine having received advice that Count Teckely marched towards Presbourg, having a body of Turks joyned with his own Troops, his Highness advanced towards them, but the Enemy upon the news of it, thought fit to retire, whereupon the Polish Troops under the Command of the Chevalier de Lubomirski were ordered to fall upon their Rear, the Duke of Lorraine following with the whole Army in Battalia; The Turks retired in much disorder towards Newbucel, and Count Teckely repassed the Waag, having lost a great many men, most of his Baggage, and a great number of Waggonns laden with provisions, which were cut off by the Poles, who killed themselves very well.

Frankfort, August 19. We have not by the last Letters from Lintz and Passaw, any particular account of the Siege of Vienna, but in the general we are assured that the besieged make a brave defence, and that the place is in no danger as yet, The Auxilliary Troops of the Empire are halting to their relief; and it's confidently said, that the King
