Ships sailing from the eastward will open the light when bearing N. W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W. westerly, and whether going up or down Channel, when to the eastward of Beachy Head, and within three leagues of it, by keeping the light open, will pass to the southward of the Southern Head, and all other shoals in its vicinity.
