The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-
sixth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled
"An Act to empower His Majesty to suspend
the ballot or enrolment for the local militia," it is
enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty; by
any Order in Council, to direct that no ballot or en-
rolment for the local militia shall take place, but
that such ballot and enrolment shall remain and con-
tinue suspended for the period specified in any such
Order in Council, and from time to time by any like
Order or Orders in Council, to continue such sus-
pension so long as His Majesty shall deem the same
expedient, any thing in any Act or Acts of Par-
liament to the contrary notwithstanding; and whereas
by an Order in Council, made the thirtieth of

June one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven,
it was ordered by His Majesty in Council, that no
ballot or enrolment for the local militia should take
place for the space of one year from the sixteenth of
July one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven,
but that the ballot should remain and continue
suspended for the space of one year from the said
sixteenth of July; and whereas it is deemed ex-
pedient to continue such suspension of the ballot
and enrolment for the local militia for the space of
one year from and after the sixteenth day of July
in this year; it is, therefore, ordered by His Ma-
jesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council,
that no ballot or enrolment for the local militia do
take place for the space of one year from and after
the sixteenth day of July in this year, but that
the ballot or enrolment for the local militia do re-
main and continue suspended for the space of one
year from and after the sixteenth day of July next.

*Archbishop of Canterbury, for a Collection for the
Purpose of enlarging and building of Churches and
Chapels in England and Wales.*

GEORGE, R.

MOST Reverend Father in God, Our Right
Trusty and Right Entirely Beloved Coun-
cillor, We greet you well: whereas the Incorporated
Society for promoting the Enlargement, Building,
and Repairing of Churches and Chapels have by
their petition humbly represented unto Us, that in

the year 1818 a Society was instituted under Our patronage, by the name of the Society for promoting the Enlargement and Building of Churches and Chapels, which Society has tended greatly to promote the good and laudable objects for which it was instituted, having during the ten years of its operation assisted 577 parishes in increasing their church accommodation, by means whereof 154,680 additional sittings have been obtained, of which number 116,503 are free and unappropriated, for the use of the labouring classes; that an Act was passed in the ninth year of Our reign, intituled "An Act to abolish church briefs, and to provide for the better collection and application of voluntary contributions for the purpose of enlarging and building churches and chapels," whereby the Act of the fourth of Queen Anne, intituled "An Act for the better collecting charity money on briefs by letters patent, and preventing abuses in relation to such charities," was repealed, and the said Society was incorporated, and it was enacted, that as often as We should issue Our Royal Letters, directed to the Archbishops of Canterbury and York, authorising the collection of voluntary contributions within their provinces, for the purpose of aiding the enlargement, building, rebuilding, or repairing of churches or chapels in England and Wales, all the contributions so collected shall be paid over to the Treasurer of the said Society or his order, and be employed by the said Society in carrying its designs into effect; that the funds of the said Society are now so far exhausted that there is no disposable balance in their hands, and several applications are now depending before the Memorialists, and they have reason to expect numerous other applications, for aid towards enlarging and building churches and chapels, which aid the Society has not, in the present state of its funds, the means of supplying; and that the Memorialists therefore pray, that We would be pleased to issue forthwith Our Royal Letters, directed respectively to the Archbishops of Canterbury and York, authorising the collection of voluntary contributions within their several provinces, to be paid over to the Memorialists or their Treasurer, to be by them applied for the purpose of aiding the enlarging, building, rebuilding, and repairing of churches and chapels in England and Wales, according to the provisions of the Act of the ninth year of Our reign:

We, taking the same into Our royal consideration, and being always ready to give the best encouragement and countenance to undertakings which tend so much to the promotion of true piety and the advancement of Our holy religion, are graciously pleased to condescend to their request: and do hereby direct you, that these Our letters be communicated to the several Suffragan Bishops within your Province, expressly requiring them to take care that publication be made hereof, on such Sundays, and in such places within their respective dioceses, as the said Bishops shall appoint; and that upon this occasion the Ministers in each parish do effectually excite their parishioners to a liberal contribution, which shall be collected, in the several churches and chapels immediately after divine service, and in the course of the week following at the dwellings of the several inhabitants, by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor, assisted as far as may be by the Ministers and such other respectable inhabitants

as may be prevailed upon to attend for that purpose; and the Ministers of the several parishes are to cause the sums so collected to be paid immediately to the Treasurer of the said Society for the time being, and to be accounted for by him, and applied to the enlarging, building, rebuilding, and repairing of churches and chapels in England and Wales, pursuant to the provisions of the above-recited Act of the ninth year of Our reign:—and so We bid you very heartily farewell.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, the twenty-fifth day of August one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight, in the ninth year of Our reign.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

LIGHT-HOUSES ON THE MAIDEN OR HULIN ROCKS.

THE Corporation for preserving and improving the port of Dublin, &c. hereby give notice, that two Light-houses have been erected on the Maiden or Hulin Rocks, on the north east coast of Ireland, and off the county Antrim, which will be lighted on Monday the 5th of January 1829, and will continue from that time to exhibit two steady bright lights every night, from the going away of day-light in the evening to the return of day-light in the morning.

The Maiden or Hulin Rocks bear by compass, from the Mull of Cantire Light, S. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. distant $20\frac{1}{2}$ miles. From Sana Island, S. S. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. distant $18\frac{3}{4}$ miles. From Ailsa, W. S. W. distant 23 miles. From the Point of Coarsal, W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. distant $21\frac{3}{4}$ miles. From Copeland Island Light, N. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. distant $16\frac{1}{2}$ miles; and from the eastern extremity of Rachline Island, S. by E. distant $29\frac{1}{2}$ miles. The lights are distant from each other 320 fathoms, and bear one from the other N. W. by W. and S. E. by E. The mariner in passing these lights should give them a wide birth, there being a number of sunken rocks extending upwards of 3 miles north, and $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles south of them.
