NOTICE TO MARINERS.

CAPE WRATH LIGHT-HOUSE.

THE Commissioners of the Northern Light-houses hereby give notice, that a Light-house has been erected upon Cape Wrath, in the county of Sunderland; the light of which will be exhibited on the night of Thursday the 25th day of December next, and every night thereafter, from the going away of day-light in the evening till the return of day-light in the morning.

The following is a Specification of the Position of the Light-House, and the Appearance of the Light, by Mr. Stevenson, Engineer to the Commissioners:

Cape Wrath forms the north western extremity of the main land of Scotland, in lat. 58 deg. 36 min. north, and in long. 4 deg. 56 min. west. By compass it bears from Hoyhead in Orkney, west, distant 45 miles; from the Butt of the Lewis, E. S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. distant 41 miles; from the Rocks called the Stags of the Cape, S. W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. distant about one mile; from the Sunken Rock called the Nun, S. S. W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W. distant 15 miles; and from the Islands of Stack and Skerry, W. S. W. the former 28, and the latter 30 miles distant. This light will be known to Mariners as a revolving light, exhibiting from one and the same lantern a light of the natural appearance, alternating or changing with one tinged red; which two kinds of light successively attain their most luminous effect every two minutes, and thereafter becoming gradually less luminous, are to a distant observer totally eclipsed for a short time. The lantern light-room is elevated 400 feet above the medium level of the sea. The light of the natural appearance will, in clear weather, be seen like a star of the first magnitude, at the distance of eight or nine leagues, and at lesser distances, according to the state of the atmosphere; but the red light being

somewhat obscured by the coloured shades, will not be seen at so great a distance.

THAMES TUNNEL.

Committee-Room, 29, Bridge-Street,
Blackfriars, November 12, 1828.

At a meeting, specially summoned for this day, of the Committee of friends to the undertaking for the Thames Tunnel, acting under the authority of the public meeting, called upon the 5th of July last, for the purpose of encouraging the public support of that work, it was resolved, that a list of the subscriptions to the undertaking, since the last advertisement upon the subject was laid before the public, be now advertised in the public papers.

The paragraph in the advertisement inserted in the public papers of the 31st of July 1828, was read as follows:

“ The Committee beg leave distinctly to state to the public, that the entire sums which may be contributed under the resolutions of the public meeting, will be at the disposal of the subscribers, unless £100,000 shall be subscribed for within a limited period.”

And it was resolved, that it appears to this Committee, that the time is now arrived when it becomes them to redeem the pledge thus given.

The Committee, considering that every fair and honourable exertion, by public appeal and private application, has now been made towards effecting the object for which the Committee were appointed; and the result, upon that appeal, having been now ascertained, felt it to be their duty not to delay any longer to state, that that object had not been so far attained as to give any rational hope of a successful issue.

It was therefore resolved, that, in redemption of their pledge, the Committee do give directions, and directions were given accordingly, that all sums, advanced as subscriptions, at the disposal of this Committee towards the object of the public meeting, shall be paid back to the parties who advanced them; and that all parties who shall not, within a month from this period, have received back the moneys paid, be requested, and they are hereby requested accordingly, to apply by letter to the Secretary to this Committee, stating the London or country banker or agent, to whom they desire that the money shall be paid back on their account, and the moneys shall be paid back accordingly.

It was further resolved, that those other persons who had subscribed their names, either for debentures or donations, but not paid down the sums as subscriptions, at the disposal of this Committee, should be released, and they are hereby, on the part of this Committee, released accordingly from all obligations on account of those subscriptions.

It was resolved, that the preceding statement be advertised in the London Gazette, and in six of the principal London newspapers; and that the Committee should take, and they do accordingly take, this last opportunity of expressing their grateful thanks to those persons, who have come forward to the assistance of the prosecution of this great work; and, while the Committee lament that the object contemplated by the public meeting of the 5th of July last, has not been effected, they will not yet shrink from the expression of their confidence, that, at a more favourable moment, some national act will enable the work to be recommenced, and the Tunnel to be completed.
