THE Creditors of James Cox, late of Godalming, in the County of Surrey, Coach and Harness-Maker, an Insolvent Debtor, who was lately discharged from the Debtors Prison for London and Middlesex, under and by virtue of an Act of Parliament, made and passed in the seventh year of the reign of His present Majesty, for the relief of Insolvent Debtors in England, are requested to meet the Assignee of the estate and effects of the said Insolvent, at the Office of Messrs. Watson and Broughton, Solicitors, No. 4, Falcon-Square, in the City of London, on the 24th day of December instant, at Eleven o'Clock in the Forenoon precisely, to assent to or dissent from the said Assignee agreeing and paying, or satisfying, out of the said Insolvent's estate and effects, a certain charge or lien claimed on the lease of certain premises belonging to the said Insolvent's estate, situate at Godalming, in the County of Surrey, and to the sale and disposal of such lease, by private

contract or by public sale, and to accept such terms for the payment thereof in the former case as the said Assignee may think fit, and also to the allowance and payment of certain law charges connected with the affairs of the said Insolvent, and to the adopting such proceedings at law or otherwise against the person and persons to be named at such meeting as the said Assignee may be advised in respect of the granting such lease or connected therewith, and to the bringing or defending any action or actions for the recovery and protection of the said Insolvent's estate and effects; or to the compounding or otherwise any debt or debts due from or to the said estate; and on other special and usual affairs relating thereto.

THE Creditors of William Summers, late of Briston, in the County of Norfolk, Thresher and Farmer, lately a prisoner in the Gaol of Norwich, and who sought relief under and by virtue of an Act of Parliament passed in the seventh year of reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend and consolidate the Laws for the Relief of Insolvent Debtors," are requested to meet at the King's Head, at Holt, in the County of Norfolk, on Wednesday the 7th day of January next, at Three o'Clock in the Afternoon, when and where the Assignee of the said Insolvent's estate will be prepared to declare the amount of balance in his hands, and in pursuance of the order of the Court of Commissioners for the Relief of Insolvent Debtors, bearing date the 25th day of November 1828, will declare a Dividend thereof amongst such of the Creditors of the said Insolvent, whose debts are admitted in the schedule of the said Insolvent filed in the said Court, and who shall prove their debts by affidavit at the said meeting according to the provision of the said Act.—If any Creditor intends to prove a debt to be due to him from the said Insolvent, or if the said Insolvent, Assignee, or any Creditor intends to object to any debt admitted in such schedule proved as aforesaid at the said meeting, such objections must be brought forward at the said meeting, in order that the same may be enquired into and determined according to the said Act.—And all Creditors of the said Insolvent, whether their debts are admitted in the said schedule or not, who shall not come prepared at the said meeting, with proof of their debts by affidavit to the satisfaction of the said Assignee as required by the said Act, will be excluded the benefit of the said Dividend.
