And that to the uttermost of our Powers, shall endeavour to Discover and Defeat all Trayterous Conspiracies and Associations whatsoever, which are or shall be against the same dayly, and earnestly praying for Your Majesty's Long and Happy Reign over us; and for Your Success against all the Enemies of Your Sacred Person and Government.

THAT we Your Majesties Dutiful and Loyal Subjects, being fully satisfied of a Traiterous, Bloody, and Horrid Conspiracy against the invaluable Lives of Your Sacred Majesty and Dearest Brother James Duke of York, and tending to the Subversion of the Government both in Church and State, secretly contrived by ill-affected and desperate Persons, some of whom are already Convicted, others, to avoid the stroke of Justice, are either fled, or else have laid violent hands upon themselves.

In a due sense of the signal Deliverance of Your Majesty from this Trayterous and Bloody Conspiracy, we return our unfeigned Thanks unto Almighty God, and as particularly in duty bound, do most humbly beg Your Majesty to be Assured, that we are ready to lay down our Lives and Fortunes in defence of Your Royal Person, Your Heirs and Successors, and the present Government as it is established in Church and State, and shall ever pray for Your Majesties long Life and Prosperous Reign, and that Your Enemies may fall before You.

WH Your Majesties most Dutiful and Loyal Subjects, taking notice, and being fully satisfied of the most Horrid and Hellish Conspiracy of Wicked and Ungrateful Persons, to Murder Your most Sacred Majesty, and His Royal Highness (Your Dear Brother) and to Subvert the Laws and Government of Your Kingdoms, and involve them in Blood and Confusion; makes us recollect and deeply sensible of the Miserable Effects of the late unparalleled Rebellion, the execrable Murder of Your Sacred Father, the Subversion of Laws and Government, and the Tyranny then exercised upon Your People: And being now fully convinced that these detestable Contrivances are now hatch'd and managed by like Monsters of Men, whose Principles lead to the Extirpation of Monarchy (the most Divine of Governments) gives us this occasion to detest and abhor that Damnable Doctrine by them profess'd and practis'd, that Kings may be kill'd and depos'd by their Subjects. And to magnifie that Providence, which (almost by Miracles) has so often preserv'd Your Sacred Majesty; and constrains us freely and cheerfully to devote our

Lives and Fortunes for the Preservation of Your Royal Person, and the Regal Line in its Legal Succession, and Your Government as now established. And most devoutly do Pray for the Blessing of Your Long and Prosperous Reign, and that that Line may have no end till Time ceases. Dread Sovereign,

After our hearty Thanks to Almighty God for the Miraculous Deliverance of the Person of your most Sacred Majesty, and of your Dearest and Royal Brother James Duke of York, from the Traiterous and most Hellish Conspiracies of Persons Disaffected to the Established Government, which we have for many years most happily enjoyed under the Gracious Reign of your Self and Royal Progenitors

We Your most Faithful and Loyal Subjects do once more Humbly presume to assure your Majesty, That as nothing is dearer to us than your Majesties Safety and long continuance among us, by nothing shall be wanting in us on all occasions, when your Majesty shall Command, to witness the same with the assistance of our Lives and Fortunes which we shall think well hazarded in the defence of your Majesties Sacred Person and just Prerogative, and the Government of Church and State.

And we further (Great Sir) do assure your Majesty, That when in your Princely Wisdom you shall think fit to call the great Council of the Nation together, we will, to the utmost of our powers, endeavour a return of such Representatives, the issue of whose Consultations may fully answer your Majesties expectations, and the end of their sitting in Parliament.

That God Almighty, the Protector of his Vice-gerents, and who covered Your Head in the day of Battle, and hath since so often and so miraculously defended your Sacred Person, would still Preserve your Majesty and his Royal Highness from the Combined Stratagems and Barbarous Attempts of your Afflicted and most Malicious Enemies, shall be the daily Prayer of
