Dread Sovereign,

THE most Treacherous Conspiracies of divers ill affected and desperate Persons against your Majesties Royal Person, and of Your Dearest Brother, James Duke of York, Obliges us Your Majesties most Loyal and Dutiful Subjects, again to present our selves before your Royal Feet, declaring our utmost detestation of all their Impious Practices whatsoever, and beseeching Your Majesty to receive this great Truth from us, that nothing in this World can be more acceptable to us than to be effectually Serviceable to your Majesty in the total Extirpation both of the Persons and Principles of these most desperate Traitors, who under the specious pretence of Religion and Liberty, use their utmost endeavours to execute most desperate Treasons, and abominable Treacheries.

And also declaring unto your Royal Majesty, that it is the faithful Resolution of every particular Person hereunto Subscribed, to Sacrifice our Lives and Fortunes in Your Majesties immediate Service, and for the Preservation of Your Majesties Royal Person, and the Person of Your Dearest Brother, James Duke of York.

And in order thereunto, we are resolved from time to time, whensoever we shall be by your Majesty thereunto called, to Elect and Appoint such Persons in Places of Trust, as are very well known for their true Loyalty to You their most Gracious Prince, and their Faith and Obedience to the Church and State, as it is now Established by Law.

To the King's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Lord-Lieutenant, High Sheriff, Deputy-Lieutenants, Justices of the Peace, Grand Jury, and others the Gentlemen of the County of Sussex, at the Assizes held at East-grinfield in the aforesaid County, on Monday the Three and twentieth Day of July, in the Five and thirtieth Year of Your Majesties Reign.

WE do most Joyfully acknowledge the Providence and Goodness of God in preserving your Majesties Person, and your Royal Brother, from the most wicked Designs of those, who under pretences of Conscience and Publick Good, have Barbarously attempted the Life of your Majesty, and the Subversion of the Government.

And we do here make our Solemn Protestations to stand by and Defend your Sacred Majesty and Lawful Successors, against all Plots, Associations, and Rebellious Conspiracies whatsoever; and whenever your Majesty shall in Your Wisdom think fit to call a Parliament; we shall hold our selves oblig'd in

We shall make it our hearty Prayer to God, to Preserve your Majesty from the Fanatical and Impious Conspiracies of all Persons Dissenting and Disaffected to the Established Government, and that the Crown may remain in Your Royal Family in a due Succession for ever.

WE Your Majesties Lieutenant, Deputy-Lieutenants, Colonels, and other Officers of the Militia for the West-Riding of the County of York, Being extremely Alarm'd at the late Horrid and Execrable Design against Your Majesties Sacred Person and Government, and His Royal Highness the Duke of York, Do most humbly beg that your Majesty will have so great a confidence in us Your Majesties most Dutiful and Faithful Subjects, as to be assured, that to the utmost of our powers we shall upon all occasions, and at all times, be ready, not only to use all endeavours possible towards the discovery of any Treasonable Design against your Majesty, but shall be ready with all cheerfulness and duty, to Sacrifice both our Lives and Fortunes to defend Your Majesties Sacred Person, your Heirs and Lawful Successors, and the Government both in Church and State, as now Established, against all Evil and Traiterous Conspiracies, from what Party soever, any thing of so Black and so Horrid a nature shall proceed. May it please Your most Excellent Majesty,

WE the said Mayors, Bayliffs, Jurats, and Commons of the Cinque-Ports, two Ancient Towns, and their Members, By Your Majesties Grace and Favour enjoying the Privileges of Assembling together this day at a Brotherhood and Guestling, being an Authority which Your Majesty and Royal Progenitors have confirmed to us according to our Ancient Usage and Custom, and not having had the opportunity of Assembling together for many Years last past, think it our bounden Duty to offer to Your Majesty our Loyal and Thankful Obedience, and most humbly beseech your Majesty to accept of this our sincere Duty and Obedience, wherein we offer unto Your Majesty, as the first Fruits of this our Assembly, the deep Sense we have of the many Deliverances, Your Majesty (through the wonderful Providence of Almighty God) hath received from many Damnable Plots and Devilish Conspiracies, which wicked and malicious Men have been most Barbarously Contrived and carried on.
