Lintz, August 30. Their Imperial Majesties art rived here the 25th. The Empress will lie in here; and the Emperor will part from hence for Krembs, to meet the King of Poland at his arrival there; who, as our Advices tell us, was to beth s' day, with the main of his Army at St Nielaesburg, and will joyn the Duke of Lorrain about the 4th of 5th of the next Month. The News of the defeat of 15000 Turks and Tartars, is confirmed in the lame manner we related in our last, as is likewife that of Major General Dunetralde's having possessed himself of a very advantageous Post in the Forest of Vienna but we hear nothing farther of what was reported of the Turks having given an affault to Fienna the 21. Instant, and their having lost 2000d men, and the Besieged 5000. We have no fresher eccount of what has passed at Pienna, than that of the 19th: when things were in as good a condition there as could be expected.

Cologne, September 7. The Advices we receive from Liniz and other places, confirm the account we had of the defeat of the 15000 Turks by the Duke of Lorrain, and of Major General Duke waldr's having secured a very insportant Poli in the Forest of Vienna. But as for the assault it was said the Turks gave to Frema the 21. pall, some Letters speak of it, and say the Turks lost 6000 men, but

without any certainty.

Hugues September 1 1. "The 5th inflatt the Prince of Orange returned hither from the Polume; no on the 8th the States of Holland were compleatly allembled for the fifth time fince their fall Recess, His Highnels being present. It's faid His Highnels has given one o ders for feveral Troops to march towards Brabane, and that they are 10 encamp in the Neighborhood of Boldud. The Men of War appointed for the reinforcement of our fleet now at Sca with be ready to fail in few days.

Paris, September Ir. The oth Inflant the Earl of Dumbatton and Colonici Nichols, being fent by His Majerty of Great Privain, and His Royal High ness, to make their Complements of Condolarte ar this Court open the Death of the Queen, had their Audience of the King, the Dauphin, &c.
