E your Majesties most Dutiful and Loyal Subjects being deeply sensible of the late horrid, damnable, and unparabelled Conspiracy against your Sacred Majesties Person and Government, and your dear Brother His Royal Highness the Duke of York; contrived and acted by men of Bale, Trairerous, and Seditious Principles, designing to stirup the People of these your Majesties Kingdoms, to another Civil and Leasties Wars and to alter the Covernment both Civil and Intestine War, and to alter the Government both or Church and State; Do hereby declare that we do from our hearts unfeignedly abbor and detelf all fuch hellith and bloody Confpiracies, and the Abettors thereof.
