 transported with joy to hear of Your Sacred Ma-
 jesties wonderful Deliverance, continued Preservation and
 Safety, together with that of His Royal Highness Your
 Dearest Brother, from the late discovered Plots and Secret
 Conspiracies of Cruel, Wicked, and unreasonablen men of
 Fanatical and Atheistical Principles! And as much amazed
 with Horror, when we seriously consider the evil Con-
 sequences that would ensue, if such Devilish Designs had taken
 effect. Do therefore bless and praise the Almighty God who
 hath discovered and hitherto defeated, such their deep and
 Damnable Confuls and Machinations. And we further assure
 Your Majesty, that from our very Hearts we abhor and ut-
 terly detest this and all other Plots, Allocations, and Com-
 binations whatsoever, that may be deligned or attempted
 against Your Majesties Sacred Person, Your Heirs and lawful

Vienna, September 16. The 12 instant this City,
 after a Siege of 80 days was happily relieved; The
 Enemy (as you have been already informed at
 large) abandoning their Camp, their Baggage and
 Artillery, and retiring in great disorder, and the
 Christians, being wearied with the long duty they
 had been upon, and for that the night was at hand,
 not thinking fit to pursue them. The 13. the King
 of Poland, accompanied with Prince *Alexander*,
 his Son, and the Elector of *Bavaria*, came into
 the Town, having been received without the Gates.

by the Count *de Stramburg*, and the Chief Officers of
 the Garrison, they went directly to the Chapel of
Nostre Dame de Loreto, and having performed their
 Devotions, visited the Works, and then returned
 to their Camp. The same day the Count *de Stram-
 berg*, went to pay his Duty to the Emperor at
Closter Neubourg, and was received by his Imperial
 Majesty with great demonstrations of kindness and
 esteem. The 14. the Emperor arrived here by
 Water, being received at his Landing, by the E-
 lectors of *Saxony* and *Bavaria*, attended by their
 Guards, by the Count *de Stramburg*, the Magi-
 strates &c. the Garrison was posted on the Bastions,
 as it was during the Siege, the Burgers were in
 Arms, and all the Cannon round the Town were
 thrice discharged; The Emperor visited the Basti-
 ons and other Works ruined during the Siege, and the
 several Retrenchments the Besieged had made with-
 in the Town, and then went to *St. Stephens* Church
 where *Te Deum* was sung; that done, his Imperi-
 al Majesty went to the Arch Dukes Palace, his
 own not being in a condition to receive him; where
 his Imperial Majesty gave public Audience, and Di-
 ned with the 2 Electors; Towards Evening the Duke
 of *Lorraine* arrived here; He was received by his Im-
 perial Majesty in a most-obliging manner, and had a
 long Conference with him. Yesterday his Imperial
 Majesty went to see the Army, which was encamped
 about 2 miles from this place, the 2 Wings reaching
 towards *Ebersdorf* and *Luxembourg*; His Imperial Ma-
 jesty came first to the Bavarian Troops, the Elector
 was at the head of them, and Saluted the Emperor
 with his Sword; and having performed his Comple-
 ments, accompanied his Imperial Majesty to the
 Polish Camp; The King of *Poland* had drawn up
 his Army in Battalia, and being attended with the
 Great Marshal, and several Senators of *Poland*, ad-
 vanced to meet the Emperor; they Saluted each other
 on horseback, and after a short interview the Em-
 peror went to see the Polish Army, and afterwards
 returned hither; and the King of *Poland* decamped
 with his Army and marched to *Wischa*, and this
 day the Duke of *Lorraine* followed with the Emperors
 Forces. We hear every day more and more partic-
 ulars of the Enemies Losses. The King of *Po-
 land* has the Vicers Rich Tent, and the Moneys
 found in it, which it's said amount to a very great
 sum, with the Grand Signors Standard, adorned
 with precious Stones to a great value, &c. and we
 are assured that 120 pieces of Cannon have been
 taken, with vast quantities of Ammunition and
 Provisions.

Vienna, Sept. 19. The Imperial and Polish Armies
 are marched into *Hungary*, to besiege, as is said,
Newbessel, or some other important place, and in-
 tend to pass the *Danube* at *Pragsbourg*. The Elector
 of *Saxony* is returning home, his Troops having in
 order therunto repaired the *Danube*; and this day
 the Emperor parted from hence for *Lintz*. A great
 many Prisoners are daily brought hither, who are
 employed in throwing down the Works the En-
 emy made during the Siege, in clearing the Town,
 &c. We have advicd that the Grand Vicer was
 come with the remainder of his Army to *Stael-Weis-
 senburg*, and that he had caused the *Bassa* of *Buda*, up-
 on whom he lays the blame of their defeat, to be
 strangled.

Lintz, Sept. 25. We have an account from *Pres-
 bourg*, that they were making there a Bridge over
 the *Danube*, which it was believed the Polish Army
 would pass the 23; and that the Garrison of *Raak* had
 fallen upon the Turks as they passed by that place in
 great disorder, and had killed 500 of them.

Rabsbourg, Sept. 27. The Letter I from *Vienna* of
 the 23 Instant, tell us, that on the 21 the Elector
 of *Bavaria* marched with his Troops, and those of
 the Circle of *Bavaria* into *Hungary*; That on the 22
