ir, eccs; and about Five the Marquifs de Baden entred the Town; the joy of the Inhabitants being equal to the trouble at d diffraction they were in before. Our Garifon was reduced to 45 of Men, and the Enemy had made to great a breach in the Lehi Baltion, that we had reafon to fear we could not have relified their next Alfault: 11's impolible to deferibe the Fnemies Works, they are incredible, in their Trenches they were covered as well from the weather as our flot; nor can we pretend to give you here an account of all remarkable pailages during this famous siege, from which it pleafed the Divine Goodnefs, after Sixty days to deliver us. This invafides the great numbers carried into Captivity, and the defolation of this once flourifhing Countrey of Auffria, is fo great, that its Ruines cannot be repaired without many Millions, and many years.

Vienna, Ollob 10. The Letters from the Imperial Camp of the third Inflant told us, That a Party of Imperialifts and Poles had been in Action with 600 Janifari s near Newbeufel, of whom, after a fharp diffute, they killed about 200, and took 46 Prifone s; and that the King of Poland perceiving Count Teckeley is not fincere in his clealing with him in order to the making his peace with the Emperor, is refolved not to have any farther Negotiation with tim. 5000 Men of the Circle of Suabia are paffed by this place going for Hungary.

Lintz, Oflober 8? The Elector of Bavaria continues at Brun in Moravia, not having yet throughly recovered his health. Prince Waldecke is here in the fame condition. The Cavalry of the Circles of Bavaria and Franconia, are returning home, but the Inf ntry will Winter in Hungary. The Count de Zinzendorf, Great Mafter of the Emperor's Houfhold, died here the 6th Inflant. Count Berka will part from hence in few days for Denmark and Sweden, whither he goes in the Quality of the Emperor's Envoy Extraordinary.

Liniz, Offeb. 13. This night arrived here Count Lamberg from the Army, and gave the Emperor an account, That the Imperial and Pollfh Froops had defeated 10000 Turks near Barkan; That 6000 were killed upon the place, and 8 or 900 taken Prtfoners; That among the few was the affa of Suleffria, and among the killed the new Ba a of Buda, and the Baffa of Alepto; And that the Troops in Barkan feing this Body, which was to protect them, defeated, had prefently after furrendred on difcretion. The 10th, arrived here from Madrid the Count de la Riviera, with a Supply of 100000 Crowns The Advic's from H ngur) at ure us, That the Grand Viffer had caufed Ib ahim Baffa, and 30 principal Officers more, to be farangled.

Paris, Oftob. 27. From Flanders we have an account, That Monficur de Mont. I had been obliged by a Bo ly of Spanish Horse, which far exceeded in number that under his Command, to retire under the Walls of Philipulle; That the G rilon of Luxemburg had furp ized two or three Caffles, in which were Fre ch Garifons; and that fome Troops of Audenard had attacked Mon'ieur Bouffers advanced Guard, and kille I feveral, and taken others Prifoners. Monfieur Del VII, who was fent hither by the Marquis de Gra 4, was fome days agone commanded to leave this Ki g 1 m, and accordingly he was conducted by the Officers of the Kings Houshold to the Frontiers. Within the few days a great many Commissions nav. b. en given out for the raifing of Horfe, but we do not yet hear of any for Foot. From Germany we have the good news of a fecond defeat of the Turks, who were drawn together in a Body near Gran; they were between 19 and 12000 firong, and were molt of them cut in pieces, after which the Chriffians mide themfelves Maflers of the Fort of Barkan.a Poll of great importance. And there are Letters which affure us that Gran is actually belieged by the Christians.
