likewise tell us, That the Marquis de Brifacier, Envoy Extraordinary from the Crown of Poland, had had his Audience of the King of Sweden, whom he affured of the earnest defire the King his Master has to enter into a flrict friendship and correspondence with his Majefly, which he not only perfwaded himfelf his Majelly was on his part very well difpofed to, but hoped he would assist the King his Master in the War he is engaged in against the Common Enemy : The lubitance of the King of Smedens answer was, That he did ve-ry much eleem the friendship of the King of Poland : That he and all Christendom could not but extol his Generous Refolutio s; That he heartily Congratulated the fuccefs of his Arms, and wilhed him the like happy progreffes for the future; and that on his part he should very readily contribute what lay in him for the advancing the Interests of Christendom. The Marquis Del Val, Envoy from the Governor of the Spanilh Netherlands, continues at the Court of the Duke of Zell, folliciting him and the other Princes of Lunemburg, to affilt the faid Netherlands. We are alfured that a marriage is treating between the Electoral Prince of Brandenburg and the Prin-We have an account that the ce's of Hanouer. Mar age het veen Prince Henry Calimir of Naffaw, Hereditary Stautholder and Captain-General of Frizeland and Groningen, and the Princel's Emilia. fccond Daughter of the Duke of Anhalt, was concluded and confummated the 25th of the laft month, at Deffaw, the Refidence of the faid Duke.

Hague, December 10. The Deputies appointed by the States of Holland to examine the report of the late Deputation to the City of Amsterdam, to in-duce them to confent to the new Levy of 16000 men, having made their Report to the Alfembly, the leveral Members defired Copies thereof, and went home to confult their refpective Principals thereupon. They returned again on Tuesday, and the next day the States were again compleatly affembled, but we do not hear that they are yet come to a final refolution in the matter of the laid Levy. Prince Cafimir Stadtholder of Frizeland and Groningen having by Letter acquainted the States General with his Marriage with the Princels of Anbalt, they have returned his Complement, and written him a Congratulatory Letter on that occafion. The Heer Van Borfele, whom the Prince of Orange lent for England to make his Complements of Condolance at that Court upon the death of the King of Portugal, returned hither yefterday. The Deputies of the Admiralties have of late had feveral Conferences with those of the State concerning the new Ships that are building, as well as other matters. The States General have published a Placaet against rash and profane Curling and Swearing,

Parin, December 8. Monficur d'Oppede, late Ambassador from this Crown in Portugal, is come back, (his Succelfor Monfieur de St. Romaine, arri-ing at Lubon feveral days before he parted from thence) but part of his Equipage, and what is much more to be lamented his Grandchildren about two and three years old, which were on board a Veffel belonging to St. Malos, have had the misfortune to fall into the hands of the Algierines, We had an account the laft week from Marfeilles, that a French Bark fent out from Thoulon, having met on

the 17th of the last month a Spanish Bark near the Ifle of Porqueroles, and pretending to vifit her, the Spaniards would not luffer it, but fired at the French, and killed fome of their Men, who returning the like, they engaged, and after a warm dispute wherein several were killed and wounded on both fides, the French took the Spanish Bark, in-which was the Prince of Moniefurchio., and carried her to Thoulon; and the Son of the Marquis du Queine; who commanded the French Bark, is come hither to give the King an account of the thing. It's rcported here that the Venetians have refolved to have at Sea the next Summer 44 Gallies, 4 Galcaffes, and 30 Men of War, and that in order thereunto the necessary preparations are making with extraordinary diligence. We are told that the Pope's Nuncio has orders to return home.

Deal, December 2. The Dartmouth Frigat came last night into the Downs, but made no stay there, continuing her Course for the River.

And for prevention of the line Frauds, the faid Bancks intends to fix bis own Name on every Tillet. for she fusure.
