have not yet confented to this Levy. Frequent Conferences are held here between the Minifters The Count de Nassaw, General of of the Allies. the Horle in the Service of this State, is made Governor of Boldue ; and Colonel Hofweghen of Sluys in Flanders.

Paris, February 16. The King having made choice of the Marquis de Chiverni to go and relieve Monficur de Seppeville, his Minister at the Emperor's Court, he is preparing for his Journey, and will begin it in few days. The Deputies of the States of Britany are at prefent here folliciting the re-efla-blilhment of the Parlement at Rennes. From Flanders we have an account, that our Troops have feveral times begun to march, but not being able to endure the Weather, were forced to return into their Quarters. The King has appointed the Marcichal de Belfonds, and the Marcichal de Schomberg, to command his Forces this next Campagne, the first in Catalonia, and the other on the fide of Navarre. The Elector of Cologne has refolved to encrease his Forces to 20000 men, and it's faid he has defired Monfieur de Choifeul to command them.

Plimouth, February 8. Laft Tuefday night a Dutch Ship of 300 Tuns, laden with Wine and Brandy, was caft away about ten miles to the Eaftward of this place, all the men faved; and another Dutch Ship was caft away a little to the Weltward. The fame night were likewife loft a fmall Collier from Wales, and a Vefel belonging to Scilly from Virginia.

Weymouth, February 9. We have an account of two Dutch Merchant Ships that have been lately call away upon these Coasts, the St. Fohn of Amster-dam, of 400 Tuns, laden with Wine and Brandy, all the men loft; and the Fuffrow of Amsterdam, a Galliot of 150 Tuns, laden with Chefnuts and Walnut Planks, all the men faved except one : Befides theie, we hear that the Angle of Amjlerdam was loft on the 18th of December near Morlaix, the men all faved. Last Tuesday night it blew a very violent form, during which two Ships were caft away near Scilly; the one called the Toung mans Endeavour, belonging to Scilly from Virginia, the other not known; And not far from Plimouth two Ships more, the one a Dutchman of 300 Tuns, the men faved, the other not known, but supposed to be bound from Bourdeaux, by the Wine and Brandy that was dri-A Ship of Falmouth with Coales from ven afhore. Wales, was likewife loft, the men all drowned. A French Man of War called the Dragon, of 36 Guns, is now in this Port with a French Prize which he retook from a Privateer of Offend.

Deale, February 10. Within these three days, above 50 Sail of Merchant Ships are arrived in the Downes, among which is the Perfin Merchant, Captain Bowers Commander, from the East Indies. Some of these ships have been two Months between the Soundings and the Downs.
