ARMY PRIZE-MONEY.

With reference to the aforegoing notice, intimation is hereby given, for the information and guidance of such Officers, Non-commissioned Officers, and Soldiers, and of the representatives of such Officers, Non-commissioned Officers, and Soldiers, as may desire to receive their shares in England, that the distribution, which will commence at this Office on Friday the 27th day of December instant, must (according to the Act 54th George Third, cap.
