The King, taking into His royal consideration the merits and services of Sir John Croft, of Cowlinghall, in the county of York, and of Dodington, in the county of Kent, Bart. Knight Commander of the Royal Portuguese Order of the Tower and Sword, when employed as a Commissioner for the distribution of the grant voted by Parliament for the relief of the distressed inhabitants of the ravaged districts of Portugal, has been graciously pleased, by warrant under His royal signet and sign manual, to grant unto him, the said Sir John Croft, His royal licence and authority that he, and the heirs male of his body to whom the dignity of a Baronet shall descend, may bear and use certain supporters to his and their arms respectively, as depicted in the painting annexed to the said royal warrant; such supporters being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office:

And also to command, that the said concession and especial mark of His Majesty's royal favour, be registered in the College of Arms.

The King has been pleased to grant unto Peter Adamson, Esq. Lieutenant-Colonel in the Army, sometime commanding the 4th Regiment of Caçadores in the Portuguese service, His royal licence and permission that he may accept and wear the insignia of the Royal Portuguese Military Order of the Tower and Sword, which His late Most Faithful Majesty John the Sixth, King of Portugal, was

pleased to confer upon him, in testimony of approbation of his distinguished conduct while in command of a Portuguese corps, during the Peninsular war; provided nevertheless, that the said royal licence and permission doth not authorise, and shall not be deemed or construed to authorise, the assumption of any style, appellation, rank, precedence, or privilege appertaining unto a Knight Bachelor of these realms:

And also to command, that the said royal concession and especial mark of His royal favour be registered, together with the relative documents, in the College of Arms.
