Genova, May 9.

THE third Instant arrived here the *Tyger* Frigate from *Marfeilles*; She and the *Bonadventure* will sail in a day or two for *Legborne*. They are fitting out here 25 Brigantines each to carry 80 men, and ten Gallies; the first are to be commanded by Signior *Filippo Stagno*; and the latter by Signior *Gio. Maria Doria*. *Savana* is very well fortified, and there are in it 5000 men.

Stockholm, April 26. The Sieur *Van Elaren* Ambassador Extraordinary from the States General of the United Provinces arrived here on Sunday last, having met with very bad travelling, and been above nine weeks on his way. And yesterday he had a long Conference with Count *Oxnerne* Chancellor of this Kingdom. All Officers that have employments in *Pomeran* are commanded to repair thither immediately: Colonel *Mackleer* Governor of *Stralsund* and several other Officers parted from hence yesterday; and Count *Coningmark* Governor of that Province, is preparing for his departure. An Officer is come hither to raise a Regiment for the Emperor's Service; but hitherto has made no great progress therein. Admiral *Siobla* is gone to *Carslesroon* to hasten the fitting out of the men of War that it is thought necessary to have at Sea this Summer.

Dantzick, May 6. They write from *Cracow* that the Polish Court continued at *Famaron*; That Count *Wallastein* the Emperors Ambassador was expected there in few days. That the King had appointed the Rendezvous of his Army to be the 20th of this month on the Frontiers of *Podolia*; and that in the mean time *Caminiec* was very closely blocked up. That the report that had been spread that a great Body of Turks and Tartars were marching to relieve the place, which it's said begins to be in want of Provisions, appeared to be without ground; and that the Cossacks that are subject to the Czars of *Moscow*, and live on the other side of the *Nieper*, have sent fifteen Deputies to the Castellan *Lubazewski* to offer the King of *Poland* their Service, upon condition they may continue to enjoy their Liberties and Religion; which the said Castellan hath not only in the Kings name granted them, but hath sent them Moneys and Cloaths.

Vienna, May 11. The Gallies and other small Vessels that are to be employed this Campaign on the *Danube* under the command of Count *Vecchi*, are fitting out with great diligence, and will be ready in eight or ten days; a Bridge of Boats is laid here over the *Danube*, for the conveniency of the Imperial Troops that must pass that River. From *Hungary* they write, that the Turkish Troops do draw together near *Agnia* and *Buda*, in order to attempt the relief of *Newbeusel*; That the Imperial Regiments are on their march to oppose them; and that in the mean time the Baron *de Mercy* has secured all the passages about *Newbeusel*.

These Letters add, that the Imperialists have quitted *Zeschin*, and have burnt as well the Town as the Cattle, the Inhabitants as well as Soldiers, to the number of 6000 Souls, retiring to *Karpen* and *Schemnitz*. All things are preparing for the Rendezvous of the Imperial Army; which will consist of 50000 men; besides 10000 Hungarians which the Palatine of *Hungary* has undertaken to bring into the Field; and the Troops of the Prince *de Lubomirski* which are 6 or 7000 men; And those commanded by General *Leslie* on the side of *Croatia*. Our Letters from *Poland* tell us, that that King will have an Army of 40000 men of his own Troops, besides the Cossacks who are said to be 40000 strong.

Lintz, May 13. The Emperor went from hence on Wednesday last, to the Cloyster of *Lambach*, where his Imperial Majesty intends to pass the Whitsun-Holidays. The same day the Duke of *Lorraine* arrived there from *Insprucke*, and had a long Conference with his Imperial Majesty. And yesterday his Highness returned hither; He will not stay many days here, but will hasten for *Hungary*, where the Rendezvous of the Imperial Army is appointed some days sooner than was at first resolved. It will be held the 20th of this month near *Raab*, to preserve the Forage about *Graz*, for that the Army may have use of it, if they march towards *Buda*, as it is said they will. The 11th Instant arrived here an Express from *Hungary*, being sent by General *Caprara* to give the Emperor an account, That 4000 Turks who were sent under the command of a Bassa to relieve *Newbeusel*, had in order to open their way thither, made an attempt to force a passage which was guarded by the Imperialists, but were repulsed with the loss of 2000 of their men killed upon the place, which so discouraged them, that they turned back again in great haste and disorder. On Monday last arrived here an Express with Letters from the Marquis *de Grana* Governor of the Spanish Netherlands, wherein he gives the Emperor an account, that the French have besieged the City of *Luxemburg*, having set down before the place the 28th of the last month. Upon which it's said his Imperial Majesty hath written to the Elector of *Bavaria* and to Prince *Waldeck* to hasten their march.

Parisbonne, May 5. Count *Frobenius de Furstemberg* is gone to *Munick* to confer with the Elector of *Bavaria*, before he goes to the Assembly of the Princes and States of *Suabia*, to whom he is sent by the Emperor, to press them to joyn their Troops with those of *Bavaria* and *France*. The Elector of *Bavaria* has appointed the general Rendezvous of his Forces to be held the 25th of this month near *Munick*; where Prince *Waldeck* (who hath sent Deputies to the States of *Franconia* and of *Suabia*) is expected to confer with his Electoral Highness. The Baron *Del Fal* Envoy from the Marquis *de Grana*, is gone for *Munick*, and from thence will, it's said, pass to the Emperors Court.

Fomburg, May 19. The *Lunenbourg* Troops are marching to the Rendezvous, which is appointed
