

as therein mentioned; nor unless a copy of such Order in Council, duly certified by one of the Clerks in Ordinary of His Majesty's Privy Council, shall, by the Lord President of the Council, have been transmitted to the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, or to the Lord High Treasurer, for the time being, for their or his guidance or information; and every such Order shall be published three several times in the London Gazette, and shall be laid before both Houses of Parliament, within six weeks next after the date thereof, if Parliament shall be then in session, and if not, within six weeks from the then next ensuing session of Parliament:

And whereas, in order to carry into effect the objects of the said recited Act, an Act hath been passed by the President, Council, and Assembly of the island of Nevis, intituled "An Act to provide for the maintenance, protection, and good government of apprenticed labourers, and to settle the jurisdiction and authority of special magistrates;" also "An Act to establish a local constabulary force on the several plantations in this island;" and also "An Act to alter and amend an Act, intituled 'An Act to provide for the maintenance, protection, and good government of apprenticed labourers, and to settle the jurisdiction and authority of special magistrates:':"

And whereas it is considered by His Majesty in Council, that adequate and satisfactory provision hath been made by law in the said island of Nevis, for giving effect to the said recited Act of Parliament, by such further and supplementary enactments as therein mentioned, according to the true intent and meaning of the said Act:

His Majesty is, therefore, pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared, that adequate and satisfactory provision hath been made by law in the said island of Nevis, for giving effect to the said recited Act of Parliament, by such further and supplementary enactments as therein are mentioned:

And the Right Honourable the Marquess of Lansdowne, the President of His Majesty's Privy Council, and the Right Honourable Lord Glenelg, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
