The Master of the Horse, the Master of the Buck Hounds, the Equerries and the Pages of Honour, all Officers of the Navy and Army, Militia and Yeomanry, the Lord Lieutenants of Counties and Deputy Lieutenants, are to appear at the Drawing-Rooms and State Balls in uniform trowsers and boots, agreeably to regulation.

## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the third and fourth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British

" possessions abroad," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that no goods shall be imported into, nor shall any goods, except the produce of the fisheries in British ships, be exported from, any of the British possessions in America by sea, from or to any place to the said Act, such goods shall be forfeited; and it is thereby provided, that if His Majesty shall deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to any port or ports not enumerated in the said table, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to extend the provisions of the said Act to such port or ports; and that from and after the day mentioned in such Order in Council, all the privileges and advantages of the said Act, and all the provisions, penalties, and forfeitures therein contained, subject, nevertheless, to the limitations and restrictions thereinafter provided, shall extend, and be deemed and construed to extend, to any such port or ports respectively, as fully as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said table at the time of passing the said Act:

And whereas His Majesty doth deem it expedient to extend the before-mentioned provisions of the said Act, respecting such free ports, to the port of Old Harbour, in the island of Jamaica:

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the said Act of Parliament, and in exercise of the powers thereby in His Majesty in Council in that behalf vested, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby
