We, Edward Adolphus Seymour, Esq. commonly called Lord Seymour, Robert Steuart, and Richard More O'Ferrall, Esqrs. being three of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Act of Parliament of the fifth and sixth of King William the Fourth, cap. 62, do, by this writing under our hands and seals, direct, that in lieu of all and every oath, solemn affirmation, or affidavit (oaths of office excepted) heretofore required to be taken or made by any Act or Acts of Parliament made relating to the office of the Commissioners for auditing the Public Accounts, or by any official regulation of the said office, save and except any oath which the said Commissioners are authorised by any Acts of Parliament, and have heretofore been used and accustomed to administer, and shall hereafter think fit to administer, to any Accountant or other person on the examination or investigation of any account, or any matter or thing relating thereto, or touching the receipt and expenditure of any public moneys, the following declaration shall be substituted, that is to say:

" I (or we) do solemnly and sincerely declare, that (here insert the particulars inserted, or required to be inserted, in any oath, solemn affirmation, or affidavit, in lieu of which this declaration is substituted); and I (or we) make this solemn declaration, conscientiously believing the same to be true."

And we do hereby further direct, that the same declaration, so far as it regards the substitution for any oath, solemn affirmation, or affidavit as aforesaid, heretofore required by any official regulation of the said office, shall be made and signed by the person required to make the same, in the presence
