PRESENT,

. The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the third and fourth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the general regulation of the "Customs," it is, among other things, enacted, that goods of places within the limits of the East India Company's charter shall be imported only into such ports of the United Kingdom as shall be approved of by the Lords of the Treasury, and declared by an Order in Council to be fit and proper for such importation:

And whereas the port of Limerick, in the county of Limerick, has been approved of by the Lords of His Majesty's Treasury for that purpose; His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is thereupon pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, that the said port of Limerick is fit and proper for the importation of goods from places within the limits of the East India Company's charter:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the " British possessions abroad," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that the several ports therein in that behalf mentioned shall be free warehousing ports for all the purposes of the said Act; and it is thereby further enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, from time to time, to appoint any port in His Majesty's possessions in America, to be a free warehousing port for all or any of the purposes of the said Act; and that every port so appointed shall be, for all the purposes expressed in such Order, a free warehousing port under the said Act, as if appointed by the same:

And whereas His Majesty doth deem it expedient to appoint the port of Saint George, in the Bermudas, a free warehousing port under the said Act, subject to the proviso hereinafter contained:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities in His Majesty by the said Act in that behalf vested, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order, and it

is hereby ordered, that the said port of Saint George, in the Bermudas, shall be a free warehousing port for all the purposes of the said Act:

Provided always, and it is hereby ordered, that nothing herein contained shall exempt any goods, wares, or merchandise, imported from the said port of Saint George into any of the British possessions in the West Indies, or on the Continent of South America, or into the Bahama Islands, from the payment of the duties now chargeable thereon in such places under the said Act:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

A NOTE, of which the following is a translation, has been received by Viscount Palmerston, G. C. B. His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from M. Tricoupi, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of His Majesty the King of Greece:

(Translation.)

My Lord, London, November 2, 1836.

IN order to prevent the Cholera, which is spreading itself more and more in Italy, from being introduced into Greece, the Government of the King, my august master, resolved to establish in Greece two special provisional lazarettoes for vessels, passengers, and goods proceeding from places in which the cholera prevails.

The establishment of these two lazarettoes has already taken place, one at Aghia, near Patras, and the other at, Delos, near Syra.

All vessels, passengers, and goods proceeding from countries in which the cholers prevails, will be sent to these lazarettoes, in order to perform quarantine, and will not be admitted under any pretext, into any other port in the Kingdom.

The quarantine will be for seventeen days.

The necessary measures have already been adopted in order that vessels, passengers, and goods may have every requisite security, both by sea and land, and also every facility of which circumstances may admit.

Vessels proceeding from places in which there only exists a suspicion of cholera, will not be sent into those two special lazarettoes, but will be subject, in

each port of the Kingdom, to a quarantine of observation of eleven days.

In hastening to communicate to your Lordship the foregoing sanitary regulations, I request you will accept the renewed assurances of my highest consideration.

N pursuance of an Act of Parliament, made and passed in the tenth year of the reign of His late Majesty George the Fourth, intituled "An Act for improving the approaches to London-bridge," and in
