The Tithe Commissioners for England and Wales have appointed John Strangeways Donaldson, Gent. to be an Assistant-Commissioner under the Act for the commutation of tithes in England and Wales; and the said John Strangeways Donaldson was sworn in on the 11th instant, before Sir Joseph Littledale, one of His Majesty's Justices of the Court of King's Bench, according to the provisions of the said Act.

YHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for deepening, extending, and improving the navigation of the River Dart, from Totnes-bridge to Langham-wood point, in the county of Devon," it is enacted, amongst other things, that there shall be due and paid unto the Commissioners by the said Act appointed to carry its provisions into effect, or to the person or persons appointed by them for the time being to receive the same, by the owners and masters, or other person or persons having the command, of any ships or vessels, boats, barges, lighters, or other craft, who shall carry, convey, or land any kind of goods, wares, merchandises, or effects, between Totnes-bridge and Langham-wood-point aforesaid, or in, upon, or through any part of the said River Dart, within the limits aforesaid, the several rates, tolls, and duties following, that is to say:

And that it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Commissioners, by such collector or collectors, person or persons as they shall appoint, and they are hereby authorised and empowered from time to time, and at all times from and after the time that the said deepening and improving of the navigation of the said river, within the limits aforesaid, shall have been completed, so that there shall be a depth of eight feet of water at average neap tides, which fact shall be ascertained by two surveyors, and certified under their hands to the Justices of Peace assembled at the Quarter Sessions holden at the Castle of Exeter, within the said county of Devon, and shall be published in the London Gazette and in one newspaper circulating within the southern division of the said county, to ask, demand, take, collect, receive, and recover, to and for the purposes of this Act, of and from all and every the masters,
