Venice, June 26.

E have advice that the Procurator Morofini , Captain-General of the Forces of this State, is arrived at Leffinz, and that he hath fent or-

ders to all the Gallies, that are employed on the Coasss of Dalmatia, to joyn The Morlaques continue to be very troublesome to the Turks; They have of late defeated several of their Parties; And are preparing to take the Field in a great Body, some of the Troops of t'1 State being, it's faid, appointed to joyn with them. By the way of Ragula we have an account, that the Poles and Collacks have obtained a great Victory upon the Turks on the Frontiers of Moldavia, which is Confirmed by Letters of the 27th of the last Month from Bel-We have likewise advice that the Basla of Boffina has been strangled by order of the Grand Signior, because he did not march with the Troops of that Country towards the Bridge of Fsecke, to secure it, according to the Orders he had received. The Letters from Confantinople of the 5th of May tell us; That two great Armies were raising, the one to be employed against the Poles under the command of Solyman Bassa, the Grand Signior's Caimacan; and the other in Hungary, commanded by the Bassa of Mcsopotamia, who during the Government of the late Grand Visier was disgraced: They are both esteemed viner was digraced:
They are both esteemed very good Commanders, and are well beloved by the Soldiers; And that of these two Armies, the sirst will be the greatest; but will both consist chiefly of Asiatick Troops, which are raw and undiciplined. That several Bessay were on their march with the Troops under their command towards Adrianople., That Orders had been sent to the Bassa of Smirna to put 3000 men into Candia to reinforce the Troops that are already there. That the Bassa of Damascus was appointed to command on the side of Dalmstia and Boffina, and that the Grand Signior had made his great Favorite Caplan Bassa, that is, Admiral of his Fleet, who was accordingly come to Constantinople, and pretended to put ro Sea in a short time with a Fleet of 40 Gallies.

Genoua, June 24. This week departed the Goodwill, the Rebecca, the Katherine and the Hopeful Adventure, all four for the Coast of Spain; And the Crown and Colchester are preparing to follow on The Autego Merchant failed the fame Voyage\_ two days agone for Leghorne; and in few days may

likewise depart the Legborne Merchant to lade Oyls at Oneglia; befides which there are now in this Port the Sulanna, the Advice and the Lion.

Milan, June 26. It's faid a new Alliance is concluded between the Crown of Spain and the Republick of Genous: And that befides the Levy that's making in Lombardy, our Governor. the Count de Meigar, has undertaken to raise Two thousand Swiffers for the Service of that

Vienna, June 29. We have had no Letters from Hurgary fince those that gave us an account that the Imperial Army was marching towards Pest; and that it was believed they would in their way attack Novigrad. Eleven Regimen s that had their Winter-quarters in Silesia, Stiria, &c. had not then joyned the Army; but O ders have been fent them to use all the diligence possible in their march, that so the Duke of Lorrain may be in a condition to make head against the Enemy, in case they should appear in any considerable body, to relieve Buda, as several Letters from those parts assure us they will. We are told from Cracow by Letters of the 14th Instant, that the Crown General was gone to the Army; That the King continued at Fawarow as well to confirm his health, as to expect the Ambassador of Venice, who was on his way, and whom his Majesty intended to receive there. These Letters add, That the Marquis de Bethune was arrived at Jawarow from France, but that he did not own to have any publick Character; but faid he came to serve as a Volontics in the approaching Campagne.

Lintz, June 30. Two days since arrived here the Hofman Funcke with four Standards that were taken from the Turks on the 17th Instant in the action near Gran, which he hath presented to the Emperor; and at the same time gave his Imperial Majesty a particular relation as well of the said action as of the taking of Vicegrad. His Imp. rial Majesty has given the Regiment of Cuirassiers. lately commanded by Major General Halloweil, who was killed in that occasion, to Colonel Heusler. Since we have an account, that the Duke of Lorrain has put a Garison into Vaccia; and that his Highness advanced with the Imperial Army towards Peft; And at the same time we are told that a body of 25000 Turks have passed the Bridge of Effecke, and marched towards Buda, and that they are followed by a greater number; and that the Duke of Lorrain upon the news he had of it, had fent orders to the Troops that had not yet joyned him, to hasten their march.
