From Stra: shourg we are adviced, that the Duke Mazarin is gone from Alfatia into France, and that the King of France has etherwise disposed of the Government of that Country, intending to purfue his former refolu ion of eftsblifhing a Parliament there, and making the Buon de Foinebourg (formerly a principal Minister of Sta e to the Elector of Ment?) the Prefident thereof.

From Warfaw we a e told, that the Clisus from the Grand S.igaior is not yet arrived, but dai y expected, till whole Audi nee and return, our Ambaffador Radziewsky is to con inue at the Ottoman Cou t , without making any tar-

sher addreffes to the G and Seignior.

The Polifh and German Souldiers are very much diffaelsfied, that normitaltending all the fair promifes made to them, they have as yet received no pay, which has obliged the King by his P.ocismston to order all the Citizens and M rebants in the Kingdome to give an account upon Oath of what moneys they tave in bank, and to lend it upon the fecurity of the Taxes, with a prom fe of fiven per cent fer Interest ; and al.ea.'y they have began to put it in ex cution in Warfam, where it has been vigorously opposed by many Citizens and Merchauts, for which some of them have been committed to prifon.

The Envoyes from Tartary have taken their leaves, and are difmit according to their Merits, as much diffatisfied with their enterrainment , as the Court was with their carriage, as well knowing their preventions had no corresponden-Cy with the actions of the Tartars, the Court being as little fatl fied with the Letters from the Cham, wher in he had not given him the T.tle of Good Brother , as had been formerly

Antwerp, Sept. 30. The French Army are as yet in the fame poftere as formerly about Halles from whence they are continually fer ding out their parties to spoil the Country, thre-thing out and carrying away all the Corn, and leaving very lit-tle provisions of any fort behind them, so that the great scarcity they cause in all places, will in few dayes oblige them to repair to their Winter Quarrers. Some few dayes fince a party fent out from Bruffels, fell in upon fome French that were plundering the C untrey, of whom they killed near 200, and carried off about 80 Pritoners.

Don Juan is sudder ly exp. Aed in these parts, being the erson o fi;n'd (as 'els said) to succeed the Marquels de Cafel Rodrigo in the G vernment of thefe Netherlands, and was

The French intend tog is rer their Souldiers for this Wireter for the most part in the Towns they have gained this Summer, and are accordingly taking care fo to lodge them, that they may not in the leaft be burdenforme, or a trouble to the places where they are, and to this purpose oblige the fail I was to contribute towards their maintenance, The Gley of

Lille being princularly rated at 500000 livres.

Paris, Odeb. r. Upon complaint made to his Maj. fty by Don Fereira Rebelles the Portugal Envov, That the moneyes which were cue to his Majety of Portugal by verue of the late Treaty made in Mirch paft, for the payment of the French Forces which are employed in Portugal, were not paid according to Agreement, to the great prejudice of the King his Mafter; His Maichy has been pleased to Order, That a le ge fum of money bef rthwith paid to the Dake de Beaufort at Rochell, who is to carry it into Portugal, to prevent thole Countels that might other wife be taken for default of payment to the prejudice of the French.

The Kin; het lively declared Monfieur the Prince of Conde

to be Generaliffimo of all the Forces that are to be employed in Alfatia, and his fon the Duke d' Enguien General of the Cavalry to the fame A'mr, under whom the Count de Chamilly is made Lieutenant General ; this Army being defigned to make opposition against whatfoever Forces shall be fent by the Emperour for the Succour of the Spanish Netherlands.

His Maj fty has slio effered the Command of another Army to be fent into Catalonia, to Monficur the Dake of Orleans, and his believed will be also induced to commit to him the Goverament of Languedoc. The 29th paft, the faid Duke was conveyed in a large Army Coach from St Germans en Lige to the Palace Royal, where he lyes ill of a Feaver, with a gree ain in his hear, principally occasioned by the great palas he as taken in this Summers Field-Service.

'Tis notied here that the Dake of Savoy Is to be made G. neraliffimo of all the Forces which his Majefty intends to em-

ploy sgainft the Spaniards in Italy.

'Tis here confi med that the Duke de Requelaire is to be fent into England as Ambaffador Extra rdinary from his Majefty, and that the Steur Courtin is to be employed in German to N gotiate with those Princes, and to endeavour to advance his Mij files Intereft amongst them.

Mo fieur de Louney is gone to Perenne, where be is fhorely to confer with Monfieur de Turenne about the new Levies and the orderly disposing of his MajeRies Forces into

their Wiater Quarters.

We have n w received full and certain advice, that the Emperours forces are on their march for the fuccour of Flanders, but in what number, or with what addition from the Princes of Germany, is not yet faid, which hath induced his Mijefty to give to the Prince of Conde the Command of an Army to oppole their paffage, which will confift principal of those that are already under the Marquels de Crequy which with the addition of feme others which are to be orawn out of the Kings Army, Monfieur Drumouts, and fome new Levier, may amou: t to neer 20000 men.

Tarmouth, Sept. 27. We have lately had much tempeftuous weather, which we fear may have occasioned many wrecks.
