

PURSUANT to a Decree of the High Court of Chancery, made in a cause Clapton versus Bulmer and another, any person or persons claiming to be the next of kin of William Johnson, formerly of Stokesley, in the county of York, afterwards of Galley Quay, Thames-street, in the city of London, Wharfinger, afterwards of Knebworth, in the county of Herts, and, at the time of his decease, of Mitcham, in the county of Surrey, Esq.
