Christopher Ererey Prince (sued as C. B. Prince), formerly of No. 31, Lawrence-lane, Cheapside, London, and late of No. 29, Earl-street, Finsbury-square, Middlesex, Merchant's Clerk.

Martin Rawling, formerly of Huntingdon, Huntingdonshire, afterwards of No. 7, Great College-street, Chelsea, then of No. 27, Montpelier-place, Montpelier-square, Old Brompton, and late of No. 6, Godfrey-street, Great College-street, Chelsea, all in Middlesex, Superannuated Clerk under the Honourable East India Company.

Joel Grantham, formerly of No. 48, Gower-place, Euston-square, and late of No. 14, Leicester-street, Leicester-square, having a Workshop at the back of Nos. 5 and 6, Prince's-street, Soho, all in Middlesex, Carpenter, Builder, and Undertaker.

Edward Allpress, late of Great Russell-street, Bloomsbury, Middlesex, Bookseller, Publisher, Printseller, and Stationer, in Partnership with Albert Schloss, trading some times under the firm of Schloss and Allpress, but more generally of Schloss alone, residing part of the time at Camden Cottages, Camden-town, Middlesex, and recently in Old Fish-street, Doctors'-commons, in the city of London, out of business.

Samuel Henry East (calling himself and sued as Samuel East), formerly of the Blue Posts, Holborn-bars, London, Licenced Victualler, then of the Shoulder of Mutton, Fordham, Essex, Licenced Victualler, Wine Merchant, and Butcher, then of the Bell, Lavenham, Suffolk, Innkeeper, then a Prisoner in the Fleet Prison, London, then lodging at the Sun, Portpool-lane, Gray's-inn-lane, out of business, then of the Ship Tavern, Islington, both in Middlesex, Licenced Victualler, then lodging at the Greyhound, Smithfield, London, out of business, then of the King's Arms, Whitechapel-road, Middlesex, Licenced Victualler, then of No. 31, Chancery-lane, then a Prisoner in the Debtors' Prison for London and Middlesex, then lodging in Whitecross-street, all in London, out of business, then of the Britannia, Grove-street, Deptford, Kent, Licenced Victualler, then of the City Coffee-house, Cammomile-street, London, Coffee Shopkeeper, then of Little Queen-street, Holborn, Green-Grocer and Coal-Merchant, afterwards of No. 2, New-street, Stepney, both in Middlesex, Baker, then of the Marshalsea Prison, Southwark, Surrey, then of High-street, Shoreditch, Middlesex, Eating-House-keeper, then of the White Horse, White Horse-alley, Cowcross, Smithfield, Middlesex, then of the George the Fourth, George-street, Chelsea, Beer-Shopkeeper, then of No. 5, Waterloo-terrace, Waterloo-road, Surrey, out of business, then of the One Butt, Wellington-street, Goswell-street, Saint Luke's, then of the King's Arms, Castle-street, Leicester-square, Licenced Retailer of Beer, then of the Punch Bowl Public-house, Queen-square, Moorfields, all in Middlesex, then of the Green Dragon, Fordham, Cambridgeshire, Licenced Victualler and Farmer, then a Prisoner for Debt in Cambridge Castle, Cambridge, Cambridgeshire, then of No. 52, Duke-street, Aldgate, London, out of business, then of No. 75, West-street, Smithfield, Baker and Beer-Shopkeeper, and then lodging at Bleeding Hart-yard, Hatton-garden, and late of No. 91, Long-alley, Sun-street, Moorfields, Middlesex, Tailor, during the whole of the aforesaid residences occasionally a Tailor and trading in Public-houses, Coffee-houses, and Eating-houses.
